

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE SAID SECURITIES ARE HEREBY APPROVED AS TO SUFFICIENCY AND THE COUNTY TREASURER IS AUTHORIZED TO DEPOSIT COUNTY FUNDS NOT TO EXCEED \$85,000.00 IN THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK.
