THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE BOARD WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY R. W. SAFSTROM, COUNTY AUDITOR, AND PROCEEDED TO ORGANIZE FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO ELECT A CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT D. D. MARQUETTE SERVE AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON MOVED THAT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 11-1136, 1943 CODE, BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN THAT D. D. MARQUETTE BE APPOINTED COURTHOUSE COMMISSIONER FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN THAT EACH COMMISSIONER BE APPOINTED ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMISSIONER IN AND FOR HIS OWN DISTRICT, WITH POWER TO CALL TO HIS ASSISTANCE COMMISSIONERS FROM OTHER DISTRICTS TO ACT WITH HIM WHEN NECESSARY.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED AND THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN, THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PAY BY AUDITORS WARRANTS THE FOLLOWING:

ALL SALARIES, INCLUDING JANITORS, AND CLERK HIRE AND THE SALARY AND EXPENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT PREDATORY MAMMAL CONTROL AGENT, AS FIXED BY THE BOARD AND APPROVED IN THE VARIOUS BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR 1952, OR BY LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT.

ALL ORDERS PRESENTED BY THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD TO BE PAID OUT OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND.

ALL AMOUNTS DUE THE STATE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD OF NORTH DAKOTA AND THE RURAL REHABILITATION CORPORATION OR ITS SUCCESSORS AND SARGENT COUNTY FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE SHARES OF COLLECTIONS MADE FOR LIVESTOCK FEED ASSISTANCE LOANS.

ALL BILLS FOR LIGHT AND POWER AND ALL WITHHOLDING AND SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES WITHHELD OUT OF WAGES, TO THE PROPER AUTHORITIES, AND ALL ESTIMATES ISSUED TO CONTRACTORS FOR ROAD WORK AS CERTIFIED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

MOTION CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON MOVED THAT DR. F. G. HUBBARD BE APPOINTED SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER DAWSON THAT THE SALARY OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH BE FIXED AT \$300.00 FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AND MILEAGE ACCORDING TO LAW.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF AN INSANITY COMMISSIONER.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER DAWSON THAT DR. W. D. LYLE BE APPOINTED INSANITY COMMISSIONER FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT ALL CORRESPONDENCE PERTAINING TO FEDERAL AID SECONDARY ROAD PROJECT MATTERS BE HANDLED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND REPORTED TO THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON MOVED THAT THE MOTION BE AMENDED BY SUBSTITUTING "AUDITOR" INSTEAD OF "CHAIRMAN."

COMMISSIONER KIEFER SECONDED MR. DAWSON'S MOTION AND SAME FAILED TO CARRY.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED COMMISSIONER COLEMAN'S MOTION AND SAME CARRIED, THERE BEING 3 AYES AND 1 NAY.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

ON MOTION THE BOARD ADJOURNED AT 5 O'CLOCK, P. M., TO 9 O'CLOCK, A. M., JANUARY 5, 1952.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

RAYMOND M. SMITH, REPRESENTING DALE JOHNSON OF OAKES, APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND PRESENTED A CLAIM FOR ALLEGED DAMAGES ON FURNITURE STORED IN THE COUNTY AUDITORIUM.

WALLACE LYONS CONFERRED WITH THE BOARD IN REGARD TO CAR ACCIDENT.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO OPEN AND CONSIDER BIDS FOR THE FURNISHING OF ONE USED MOTOR PATROL GRADER AS ADVERTISED.

BIDS HAD BEEN FILED BY DAKOTA TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT CO., AND NORTHWESTERN EQUIPMENT, INC.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT THE BID OF NORTHWESTERN EQUIPMENT, INC., IN THE SUM OF \$9,203.61, SAME HAVING BEEN FOUND TO BE THE BEST, BE ACCEPTED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND ON ROLL CALL ALL VOTED AYE, AND THE MOTION CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD BE AUTHORIZED TO SIGN APPLICATION TO HAVE THE ROAD BEGINNING AT GENESEO AT THE INTERSECTION OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11 AND RUNNING 7 1/2 MILES SOUTH PROGRAMMED AS A FEDERAL AID SECONDARY ROAD PROJECT.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON SECONDED THE MOTION AND ON ROLL CALL COMMISSIONERS DAWSON AND KIEFER VOTED AYE. COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD VOTED NAY AND THE MOTION LOST.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE ELECTED OFFICIALS OF SARGENT COUNTY ARE NOT NOW COVERED UNDER THE OLD AGE AND SURVIVOR INSURANCE SYSTEM, AND

WHEREAS, SECTION 52-0920, NORTH DAKOTA OLD AGE AND SURVIVOR INSURANCE SYSTEM LAW, SUBSECTION M PROVIDES FOR COVERAGE OF SUCH ELECTED OFFICIALS AS FOLLOWS:

"MEMBERS OF THE STATE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, OFFICIALS OF THE STATE, CITY, VILLAGE, TOWNSHIP, AND COUNTY, AND OTHER GOVERNMENTAL INSTRUMENTALITIES ELECTED BY THE VOTE OF THE PEOPLE; EMPLOYEES WHO ARE MEMBERS OF ANY OTHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM IN THE STATE WHICH IS MAINTAINED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY PUBLIC CONTRIBUTIONS UNLESS SUCH POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR ITS INSTRUMENTALITIES AS A WHOLE ELECT TO ADOPT THIS SYSTEM ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER. ELECTED STATE OFFICIALS MAY INDIVIDUALLY ELECT TO ADOPT THIS SYSTEM BY APPLICATION TO THE BUREAU FOR SUCH COVERAGE. SUCH COVERAGE MAY, AT THE OPTION OF THE APPLICANT, BE MADE RETROACTIVE TO JANUARY 1, 1950, UPON PAYMENT BY THE APPLICANT OF HIS ACCRUED CONTRIBUTION FOR THE RETROACTIVE PERIOD."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY HEREBY ELECT COVERAGE FOR ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS AS PROVIDED IN THE ABOVE QUOTED SECTION OF THE NORTH DAKOTA OLD AGE AND SURVIVOR INSURANCE SYSTEM LAW EFFECTIVE AS OF JANUARY 1, 1952."

COMMISSIONER DAWSON SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED, ALL VOTING AYE.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE PUBLIC DEPOSIT AGREEMENT FOR PLEDGE OF ASSETS AS SECURITY OF COUNTY FUNDS, IN THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK, COVERING \$100,000.00 U. S. 




