

FORMAN, N. DAK. JAN. 6, 1953.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE BOARD WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY R. W. SAFSTROM, COUNTY AUDITOR, AND PROCEEDED TO ORGANIZE FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

THE OFFICIAL OATH OF OFFICE WAS ADMINISTERED TO THE FOLLOWING COMMISSIONERS WHO WERE ELECTED AT THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD NOV. 4TH, 1952:

MELVIN SMITH, FOURTH DISTRICT; G. B. COLEMAN, FIFTH DISTRICT.

THE BOARD THEN PROCEEDED TO ELECT A CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT D. D. MARQUETTE SERVE AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD THAT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 11-1136, 1943 CODE, BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN THAT COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD BE APPOINTED COURTHOUSE COMMISSIONER FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD THAT EACH COMMISSIONER BE APPOINTED ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMISSIONER IN AND FOR HIS OWN DISTRICT, WITH POWER TO CALL TO HIS ASSISTANCE COMMISSIONERS FROM OTHER DISTRICTS TO ACT WITH HIM WHEN NECESSARY.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED AND THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD, THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PAY BY AUDITORS WARRANTS THE FOLLOWING:

ALL SALARIES, INCLUDING JANITORS, AND CLERK HIRE AND THE SALARY AND EXPENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT PREDATORY MAMMAL CONTROL AGENT, AS FIXED BY THE BOARD AND APPROVED IN THE VARIOUS BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR, 1953, OR BY LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT.

ALL ORDERS PRESENTED BY THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD TO BE PAID OUT OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND CORPORATION OR ITS SUCCESSORS AND SARGENT COUNTY FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE SHARES OF COLLECTIONS MADE FOR LIVE-STOCK FEED ASSISTANCE LOANS.

ALL BILLS FOR LIGHT AND POWER AND ALL WITHHOLDING AND SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES WITHHELD OUT OF WAGES, TO THE PROPER AUTHORITIES, AND ALL ESTIMATES ISSUED TO CONTRACTORS FOR ROAD WORK AS CERTIFIED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

MOTION CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

MOVED BY COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN THAT DR. F. G. HUBBARD BE APPOINTED SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

MOTION CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN THAT THE SALARY OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH BE FIXED AT \$300.00 FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AND MILEAGE ACCORDING TO LAW. COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF AN INSANITY COMMISSIONER.

ON MOTION THE APPOINTMENT WAS POSTPONED UNTIL THE FOLLOWING DAY.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED THE REPORT OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE J. H. HOMAUS, FOR THE QUARTER ENDING DEC. 31ST, 1952, SAME HAVING PREVIOUSLY BEEN APPROVED AS TO FORM BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE BOARD ADJOURN TO 9 O'CLOCK, A. M., JAN. 7, 1953.
COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT.

ON ROLL CALL ALL COMMISSIONERS WERE FOUND PRESENT.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT DR. F. G. HUBBARD BE APPOINTED INSANITY COMMISSIONER FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO ACT ON BIDS FOR THE FURNISHING OF ONE USED BULLDOZER AS ADVERTISED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE BID OF DAKOTA TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT COMPANY, IN THE SUM OF \$850.00 BE ACCEPTED, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

BULLDOZER TO BE IN GOOD REPAIR AND AI CONDITION WITH NO PARTS MISSING AND TO FIT R D 7 CATERPILLAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMITTEE OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA STATE LEGISLATURE, HAS RECOMMENDED THAT STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11 AND CERTAIN OTHER STATE HIGHWAYS BE ELIMINATED FROM THE PRESENT STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM, AND BE TURNED BACK TO THE RESPECTIVE COUNTIES, AND

WHEREAS, IN THE OPINION OF THIS BOARD, SAID RECOMMENDATION IS NOT FEASIBLE FOR THE REASON THAT SARGENT COUNTY WOULD BE UNABLE TO ADEQUATELY MAINTAIN SAID HIGHWAY NO. 11 AND FOR THE REASON THAT SAID RECOMMENDATION WOULD BE UNFAIR TO THE PEOPLE OF SARGENT COUNTY,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THIS BOARD GO ON RECORD IN FAVOR OF RETAINING SAID HIGHWAY NO. 11 IN THE PRESENT STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM AND THAT ANY PROPOSAL WHEREBY SAID HIGHWAY NO. 11 MIGHT BE TURNED BACK TO THE COUNTY, BE RESISTED BY THIS BOARD.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED, ALL VOTING AYE ON ROLL CALL.

COMMISSIONER SMITH INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, THAT SAID BOARD GO ON RECORD IN FAVOR OF THE FOLLOWING ROUTING OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11; THAT SAID STATE HIGHWAY BE ROUTED FROM A POINT ON STATE HIGHWAY NO. 32 DIRECTLY SOUTH OF THE TOWN OF FORMAN, NORTH DAKOTA;

THENCE NORTHWEST AROUND THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE TOWN OF FORMAN, TO A POINT AT THE PRESENT LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY No. 11 DIRECTLY WEST OF THE TOWN OF FORMAN; THENCE WEST ON A STRAIGHT LINE, PARALLEL WITH THE PRESENT LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY No. 11 TO THE VILLAGE OF COGSWELL, N. D., UNTIL A CONNECTION IS MADE WITH THE PRESENT LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY No. 11 WEST OF SAID VILLAGE OF COGSWELL.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED, ALL VOTING AYE ON ROLL CALL.

A DELEGATION FROM WHITE STONE HILL TOWNSHIP MET WITH THE BOARD IN REGARD TO ROAD MATTERS.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO REVIEW ITS CANCELLATION OF UNCOLLECTIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES WHICH CANCELLATION HAD BEEN MADE WHERE THE TAX WAS FOUND UNCOLLECTIBLE THROUGH DEATH, REMOVAL FROM THE COUNTY OR FOR THE REASON THAT THE PROPERTY HAD BEEN LOST BY LEGAL PROCESS OR ACQUIRED BY THE GOVERNMENT, OR FOR OTHER VALID REASONS, SAID CANCELLATION BEING IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 57-2211, 1943 REVISED CODE.






