

FORMAN, N. DAK. JAN. 6, 1959.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE BOARD WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY R. W. SAFSTROM, COUNTY AUDITOR, AND PROCEEDED TO ORGANIZE FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

THE OFFICIAL OATH OF OFFICE WAS ADMINISTERED TO THE FOLLOWING COMMISSIONERS WHO WERE ELECTED AT THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD NOV. 4, 1958:

GEORGE HOFLEN, 1ST DISTRICT; PALMER C. ENGE, 2ND DISTRICT; ELMER WALSTEAD, 3RD DISTRICT.

THE BOARD THEN PROCEEDED TO ELECT A CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT MELVIN SMITH BE ELECTED CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

11-1136, 1943 COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR, AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER REVISED CODE, BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD. COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN THAT ELMER WALSTEAD BE APPOINTED COURTHOUSE COMMISSIONER FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD THAT EACH COMMISSIONER BE APPOINTED ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMISSIONER IN AND FOR HIS OWN DISTRICT, WITH POWER TO CALL TO HIS ASSISTANCE COMMISSIONERS FROM OTHER DISTRICTS TO ACT WITH HIM WHEN NECESSARY.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED AND THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN AND CARRIED, THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PAY BY AUDITOR'S WARRANTS THE FOLLOWING:

ALL SALARIES, INCLUDING JANITORS, AND CLERK HIRE AND THE SALARY AND EXPENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT PREDATORY MAMMAL CONTROL AGENT, AS FIXED BY THE BOARD AND APPROVED IN THE VARIOUS BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR 1959, OR BY LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT.

ALL ORDERS PRESENTED BY THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD TO BE PAID OUT OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND.

ALL AMOUNTS DUE THE STATE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD OF NORTH DAKOTA AND THE RURAL REHABILITATION CORPORATION AND ITS SUCCESSORS AND SARGENT COUNTY FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE SHARES OF COLLECTIONS MADE FOR LIVESTOCK FEED ASSISTANCE LOANS.

ALL BILLS FOR TELEPHONE, LIGHT AND POWER AND ALL WITHHOLDING AND SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES WITHHELD OUT OF WAGES, TO THE PROPER AUTHORITIES, AND ALL ESTIMATES ISSUED TO CONTRACTORS FOR ROAD WORK, AS CERTIFIED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT DR. F. G. HUBBARD BE APPOINTED SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR, AND HIS SALARY BE FIXED AT \$300.00, AND MILEAGE AS PROVIDED BY LAW. COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF AN INSANITY COMMISSIONER.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT DR. F. G. HUBBARD BE APPOINTED INSANITY COMMISSIONER FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS.

COMMISSIONER ENGE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE PUBLIC DEPOSIT AGREEMENT, FOR PLEDGE OF ASSETS AS SECURITY FOR COUNTY FUNDS, IN THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK, COVERING \$100,000.00 U. S. CERTIFICATE OF INDEBTEDNESS, SERIES C-1959, 1 5/8%, DUE AUGUST 1, 1959 #6248 @ 100M, WITH THE NORTHWESTERN NATIONAL BANK OF MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., AS CUSTODIAN, BE APPROVED AS TO SUFFICIENCY, ACCORDING TO LAW.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A LARGE DELEGATION FROM WHITE STONE HILL TOWNSHIP MET WITH THE BOARD IN REGARD TO HIGHWAY MATTERS.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE APPLICATION OF HERMAN SEBENS, FOR A REFUND OF SCHOOL POLL TAXES FOR THE YEAR 1957 IN THE SUM OF \$2.00 IN WILLEY TOWNSHIP, BE APPROVED FOR THE REASON THAT APPLICANT HAD BEEN ASSESSED SCHOOL POLLS FOR HIMSELF AND WIFE IN BOTH WILLEY TOWNSHIP AND CITY OF MILNOR, FOR SAID YEAR, AND THAT HE AS PAID SAID TAX.

WHEREAS CHAPTER 57-2221, 1943 REVISED CODE PROVIDES THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SHALL, AT ITS JANUARY MEETING, DECLARE BY RESOLUTION THAT ALL UNPAID AND UNCANCELLED PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES, SHALL CONSTITUTE A LIEN ON ANY REAL ESTATE OWNED BY THE TAX DEBTOR, FROM AND AFTER THE DATE OF EXTENSION AND ENTRY THEREOF, BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR UPON THE TAX LIST OF THE NEXT PRECEDING YEAR, OPPOSITE THE DESCRIPTION OF THE REAL ESTATE DESIGNATED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, BELONGING TO ANY PERSON, COMPANY OR CORPORATION OWING SUCH UNCOLLECTED PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES, THE YEAR OR YEARS FOR WHICH THE TAX REMAINS DUE AND THE PRINCIPAL SUM OF SUCH TAX; AND THAT SUCH ENTRY SHALL BE MADE WITHOUT REGARD TO ANY PRIOR PAYMENT OF REAL ESTATE TAXES ON SAID DESCRIPTIONS FOR THE PRECEDING YEAR, AND THE COUNTY TREASURER SHALL BE WITHOUT AUTHORITY THEREAFTER TO ISSUE ANY RECEIPT IN FULL FOR SAID REAL ESTATE TAXES WITHOUT MAKING COLLECTION AT THE SAME TIME OF THE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES SO EXTENDED, AND

WHEREAS SAID BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HAVE CANCELLED SAID UNCOLLECTIBLE DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES AT ITS JANUARY MEETING AS PROVIDED BY LAW,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT ALL UNPAID AND UNCANCELLED DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES FROM AND AFTER THE DATE OF THE EXTENSION AND ENTRY THEREOF AS PROVIDED IN THE FOREGOING SHALL CONSTITUTE A LIEN ON ANY REAL ESTATE OWNED BY THE TAX DELINQUENT, OR WHICH MAY THEREAFTER BE ACQUIRED BY THE TAX DELINQUENT, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE FOLLOWING PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES OWED SHALL BE A SPECIFIC LIEN UPON THE PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:




