THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE WITH COMMISSIONERS DAWSON AND COLEMAN PRESENT, THE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BOARD WERE UNABLE TO ATTEND ON ACCOUNT OF BLOCKED ROADS.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE BOARD WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR, R. W. SAFSTROM, AND PROCEEDED TO ORGANIZE FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT G. B. COLEMAN SERVE AS CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND ON ROLL CALL COMMISSIONERS MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD VOTED AYE; COMMISSIONERS DAWSON, COLEMAN AND KIEFER VOTED NAY. MOTION LOST.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT GEO. C. DAWSON SERVE AS CHAIRMAN FOR THE ENSUING YEAR. COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND ON ROLL CALL COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, DAWSON, KIEFER AND MARQUETTE VOTED AYE, WALSTEAD NOT VOTING. MOTION CARRIED.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE ORDER OF BUSINESS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AS PROVIDED BY CHAPTER 11-1136, 1943 CODE, BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER KIEFER THAT GEO. C. DAWSON BE APPOINTED COURTHOUSE COMMISSIONER FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER COLEMAN AND SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER KIEFER AND CARRIED, THAT EACH COMMISSIONER BE APPOINTED ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMISSIONER IN AND FOR HIS OWN DISTRICT, WITH POWER TO CALL TO HIS ASSISTANCE OTHER COMMISSIONERS TO ACT WITH HIM WHEN NECESSARY.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PAY BY AUDITORS WARRANTS THE FOLLOWING:

ALL SALARIES, INCLUDING JANITORS, AND CLERK HIRE AS FIXED BY THE BOARD AND APPROVED IN THE VARIOUS BUDGET REQUESTS FOR THE ENSUING YEAR 1950, OR BY LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT.

ALL ORDERS PRESENTED BY THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD TO BE PAID OUT OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE FUND. ALL AMOUNTS DUE THE STATE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD OF NORTH DAKOTA AND THE RURAL REHABILITATION CORPORATION OR ITS SUCCESSORS AND SARGENT COUNTY FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE SHARES OF COLLECTIONS MADE FOR LIVESTOCK FEED ASSISTANCE LOANS.

ALL BILLS FOR LIGHT AND POWER AND ALL WITHHOLDING AND SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES WITHHELD OUT OF WAGES, TO THE PROPER AUTHORITIES.

SALARY AND EXPENSES OF GOVERNMENT PREDATORY MAMMAL CONTROL AGENT, AND ALL ESTIMATES ISSUED TO CONTRACTORS FOR ROAD WORK, AS CERTIFIED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER THE APPOINTMENT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE THAT DR. F. G. HUBBARD BE APPOINTED SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE ENSUING YEAR.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE SALARY OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH BE FIXED AT \$300.00 FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AND MILEAGE ACCORDING TO LAW.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

IT WAS MOVED BY COMMISSIONER KIEFER THAT DR. W. D. LYLE BE APPOINTED INSANITY COMMISSIONER FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A DELEGATION FROM MILNOR APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD IN REGARD TO SNOW REMOVAL.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO INSPECT THE COUNTY JAIL AND FOUND SAME TO BE IN GOOD CONDITION, GENERALLY.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.



THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER PROPOSALS FOR DEPOSITS OF COUNTY FUNDS, AND TO DESIGNATE DEPOSITORIES.

PROPOSALS HAD BEEN FILED BY THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK AND FIRST NATIONAL BANK, MILNOR.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT THE SARGENT COUNTY BANK AND THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK, MILNOR, BE DESIGNATED DEPOSITORIES OF COUNTY FUNDS.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED, ALL VOTING AYE.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS SARGENT COUNTY BANK HAS BEEN DESIGNATED A DEPOSITORY OF COUNTY FUNDS AND HAD OFFERED A UNITED STATES CERTIFICATE OF INDEBTEDNESS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000.00 WHICH HAS BEEN PLEDGED AS SECURITY FOR REPAYMENT OF DEPOSITS, AND

WHEREAS SAID SECURITIES HAVE BEEN DEPOSITED IN THE NORTHWESTERN NATIONAL BANK OF MINNEAPOLIS, MINN., AND WILL BE HELD THERE FOR SAFEKEEPING, ACCORDING TO CHAPTER 21-0409, 1943 R. C. AND
