The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioners Walter Orth, John M. Manikowski, Ardell Johnson, Magnus Anderson and H. L. Anderson present.

The meeting was called to order by Sherry Hosford, County Auditor, and the Board proceeded to organize for the ensuing year.

Commissioner Orth moved that Magnus W. Anderson serve as Chairman for the ensuing year. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that H. L. Anderson serve as Vice-Chairman for the ensuing year. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Johnson moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Motion by Commissioner Johnson and second by Commissioner Anderson that Walter Orth serve as Courthouse Commissioner for 1982. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Johnson and second by Commissioner Orth that H. L. Anderson serve as Weed Commissioner for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Manikowski and second by Commissioner Anderson that Ardell Johnson serve as Road Commissioner for the ensuing year. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Manikowski and second by Commissioner Johnson that Matthew C. Kidd, MD be reappointed Superintendent of the Board of Health. Term ending January, 1983. Motion carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Public Depository Agreement for pledge of assets as security for County Funds in the Sargent County Bank, Forman, ND and First National Bank, Milnor, ND be approved as to sufficiency according to law. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the County Auditor be instructed to call for sealed bids in the official newspaper for Election Supplies required to be used with the Computer Election System. Bids will be opened February 16, 1982 at 2:00 p.m. in the Commissioners Room, Sargent County Courthouse, Forman, ND. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the County Auditor be instructed to call for sealed bids in the official newspaper for furnishing supplies, purchasing culverts, etc. for the period beginning April 1, 1982 and ending March 31, 1983. Bids to be opened March 2, 1982 as follows: Culverts 10:30 a.m.; Bridge Plank and Concrete Bridge Decks 11:30 a.m.; Screening, Hauling, Crushing, Loading and Stockpiling Gravel 1:00 p.m.; Mixing, Drying, Laying Blacktop Surfacing 1:15 p.m.; Rental of Bridge Building Equipment and Labor for Bridge Construction Repair 1:30 p.m.; Rental of Highway Building Equipment and Disaster Emergency Snow Removal 1:45 p.m.; Oil, Grease, Tires, Regular and Unleaded Gas, Diesel Fuel and other Supplies 2:00 p.m.; Cutting Edges 2:30 p.m.; and Asphalt Supplies 3:00 p.m. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

A motion was made by Commissioner Orth to hold regular Sargent County Board of Commission meetings on the first and third Tuesday of each month. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Anderson moved that the County Auditor be authorized and directed to pay by Auditor's Warrants the following: All bills for telephone, electricity and all withholding and social security taxes. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that Irene A. Robbins, Sargent County Treasurer, be given the authority to invest county funds. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the following amounts be placed on building contents for insurance purposes: Rutland Shop - \$5,000.00 and Forman Shop - \$15,000.00. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Leon Johnson, Squad Leader, Sargent County Ambulance - Forman, informed the Board of a class which had been presented and attended by 6 people to become instructors for CPR, a Red Cross course which is scheduled to begin the latter part of January and problems they are having with the radios and beepers. Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board approve the purchase of 6 new pagers at approximately \$220.00 each for use with the Forman Ambulance. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Allen Olson, County Extension Agent and Judi Hornseth, Area Home Economist met with the Board and presented the Sargent County Extension Highlight Report for 1980-1981 and also a list of all classes available during the year.

Commissioner Anderson moved that \$15,000.00 be transferred from County Poor Relief to Social Welfare and that all transfers must be approved by the Board. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Alvin McLaen and George Bishoff, representing Farm Bureau, met with the Board and presented the following resolution for the Board's consideration:

We resolve that the County Commissioners of Sargent County enforce legal licensed limit of all trucks at 550# per inch of tire and the speed limit for a truck be 40 m.p.h. with a load on while traveling on the county roads.

A discussion was held and the truck regulatory was called in to the meeting also. Several alternatives were discussed and Chairman Mag Anderson appointed John Manikowski as Commissioner in charge of road restrictions. A decision will be made at a future meeting of notices to be published.

A small claim was filed by the Board against Larry J. Henry, Belcourt, ND for a delinquent ambulance bill of \$138.00. A court date is pending in Rolette County.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner Johnson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Orth moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the January payroll in the amount of \$33,581.63 be approved. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Members from the Sargent County Ambulance-Milnor Squad met with the Board and discussed the possibility of obtaining funding to purchase a Resusci Annie with a recorder and a Resusci Baby complete with electronics and signal box. Commissioner Manikowski moved that these purchases be approved by the Board. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously. Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board rescind action that was taken July 1, 1980 in regards to Milnor Squad reimbursing the county for beepers which were purchased. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

The Board moved to have the States Attorney check into the possibility of placing a levy on all taxable valuation in Sargent County for ambulance purposes. This would have to be by vote of the electors of Sargent County.

Syd Hanson, RN, BSN, County Nurse, presented the December Narrative to the Board and reported that the North Dakota State Health Department has informed her that Sargent County is eligible to receive some free equipment. This equipment is distributed on the basis of need and will be used especially for testing children ages one to six.

Al Clark, Engineer, Ulteig Engineers, Inc. discussed CRS 4111 (52) with the Board. A Notice of Request for location and Design Approval will be published and to ensure that the public has an opportunity to consider the effects of the proposed location and design maps and sketches of the project location (from North Dakota #13, north of Stirum, north two miles) and design will be available for inspection at the County Engineer and County Auditor offices.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Sargent County Board of Commissioners join the National Association of Counties and dues which are \$200 per year be approved. Commissioners Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the El Zagal Shrines be given permission to use the Sargent County Fairgrounds in May, 1982. The charge will be \$100 a day plus electricity and insurance to be reimbursed by the Shrine organization. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve cancellations of the following mobile home tax: 1980 - #160 and 1979 - #104. The total amount to be cancelled is \$74.03. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and motion carried.

Commissioner Orth moved that the County Treasurer be given permission to destroy the 1980 and prior unused tax receipts. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried.

The Gwinner Airport Authority Board members met with the County Commissioners and explained that the condition and future of the Gwinner International Airport is in jeopardy. The levy which is placed on all taxable property in the City of Gwinner generates approximately \$2500.00 per year. Major repairs must be done this spring to the runway, which is cracking up badly. The Airport Authority Board asked for support from the Commission and the Board was informed that an opinion will be obtained from the States Attorney if there is any way the county can become involved with this project.

Commissioner Johnson moved that Sargent County Bank, Forman, ND and First National Bank, Milnor, ND be designated as legal depositories of County funds for the years 1982 and 1983. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and motion carried.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve Gambling Permit #8 to the Gwinner Grain Sharks 4-H Club for a raffle to be held on March 27, 1982 at the Forman City Hall. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and motion carried.

DeVaar Crandall, Bruce Speich, Tom Banish and Donald Dathe met with the Board to discuss the Water Management Board. They requested that whenever an appointive term expires, a notice be published in the paper to advise the public of this appointment.

The Board was informed that the term of Mike Paczkowski, Sargent County Water Management Board, will expire on February 6, 1982. After very serious and lengthy consideration, it was the Board's unanimous decision to re-appoint Mike Paczkowski to the Water Management Board. His term will expire February 1, 1987. The Board will also do some research on possibly increasing the number of members on the Water Management Board from three to five.

Curtis Freitag, Forman City Alderman, met with the Board and presented a bill for repairs to the overhead door located on the Forman City Hall as a result of an ambulance accident. A discussion was had on replacement of this door and the Board informed Mr. Freitag that they would share in the expense and suggested that he obtain another estimate.

Robert Case, States Attorney, discussed a possible ambulance levy and also a county airport authority levy which the Board will consider for 1982.

An Application for Abatement and Settlement of Taxes from Robert Mohberg, Milnor, North Dakota on Lot 3, Block 1, Klemetsons 3rd Addition, Gwinner City, was reviewed by the Board. The Gwinner City Council moved that the assessed value of the mobile home be reduced to \$700.00. Commissioner Johnson moved that they concur with the decision of the Gwinner City Council. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the bills be approved and paid. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.



The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioner Orth absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Johnson moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board approve the February payroll in the amount of \$34,631.63. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion. Commissioner H. L. Anderson, Manikowski and Mag Anderson voted aye. Commissioner Johnson did not vote. Motion carried.

Mitch Marcuson, Tax Director, met with the Board and discussed the new assessing formula for 1982. He also mentioned that he needs 60 more hours to become a certified tax director. Hopefully classes will be held this summer and he could begin training local assessors this fall.

Dave Potter, Manager, Tewaukon Refuge, presented a check to Sargent County for \$24,680.00. This money will all be apportioned to school districts and townships which have WPA's located within their boundaries. The ratio is 75% to schools and 25% to townships.

Syd Hanson, County Health Nurse, distributed her January narrative and activity summary for the Sargent County Health Department. The Board also agreed to send Karla Manikowski, Health Dept. Clerk to a three day workshop on Child Health Nursing with Mrs. Hanson. This workshop will be held March 24-26, 1982 at Devils Lake, ND.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Assessors receive \$15.00 per diem and 24¢ per mile for attending the yearly assessor's meeting. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried.

An Application for Abatement and Settlement of Taxes was submitted to the Board by Virginia Gabrielson for Lots 7,8,9 and 8' by 142' of S $\frac{1}{2}$  of Vacated Alley, Block 24, First Addition, Forman City, for the year 1981. Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board refer this application to the Forman City Council for their consideration. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried.

A Satisfaction and Discharge of Trust Mortgage was received from the Social Service Board of North Dakota executed by Ella Simmons. They are requesting Sargent County to satisfy said mortgage and request the Sargent County Register of Deeds to discharge the same record of her office. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board release this mortgage. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and motion carried.

Vivian Reinertson, Deputy Matron, presented to the Board a policy and procedure manual for the Sargent County jail. This manual must be approved by the Commission.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Chairman and Auditor be authorized to execute an agreement with the North Dakota State Highway Department for the maintenance of Project No. 4111 (51) Fr. ND 13, N of Stirum, N - Bit. Surfacing - 2.0006 miles and further that the Chairman and Auditor be authorized to execute an agreement with the North Dakota State Highway Department for the construction of Project No. CRS 4111 (51) & CP 4111 (82) From ND 13, N of Stirum, N & Fr. 2 mi N of ND 13, 2 mi N. of Stirum N - Bit. Surfacing - 3.932 Miles. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board instructed the Auditor to advertise in the official paper for a full-time mechanic. A list of responsibilities is on file in the Auditor's Office. Applicants will be interviewed on April 20, 1982.

Gary Paulson, Tommy Hartness and Randy Rotenberger, members of the Gwinner Airport Authority, discussed a county wide airport levy. The Board instructed the Auditor, with the assistance of the States Attorney, to draw up a resolution and contract to be reviewed at a future meeting.

The Board proceeded to open bids for furnishing Sargent County with necessary supplies required to be used with the computer election system for the 16 precincts for the 1982 Primary and General Election or any Special Election held during the year 1982 and 1983.

Bids were received from the following companies: Globe Gazette Printing Company, Wahpeton, North Dakota and Elkins-Swyers Printing & Office Equipment Company, Springfield, Missouri.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board table their decision subject to an audit by the Auditor's Office with an acceptance to be made on March 2, 1982. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Elaine Marquette, Co. Supt. of Schools, met with the Board and discussed upcoming events that her office will be responsible for as per state instruction.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board adjourn to March 2, 1982 at 9:00 a.m.




