THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED THE REPORT OF SHERIFF L. R. KERLING, OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF MARCH IN THE AMOUNT OF \$790.23.

ON MOTION THE BOARD ALLOWED THE APPLICATION OF EARL PALMERLEE FOR A REFUND OF SCHOOL POLL TAXES PAID IN VILLAGE OF HAVANA FOR THE YEAR 1945, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2.00, FOR THE REASON THAT BOTH THE APPLICANT AND HIS WIFE HAD BEEN ASSESSED FOR TWO SCHOOL POLLS EACH.

THE QUARTERLY REPORT OF J. E. ELLSWORTH, JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, FOR THE QUARTER ENDING MARCH 31ST, 1946, HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY AS TO FORM, WAS ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AND JUSTICE FEES IN SAME ALLOWED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$9.90.




