
THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY THE CHAIRMAN AND ON ROLL CALL COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD WERE FOUND TO BE PRESENT.



GOVERNOR BRUNSDALE WAS CONTACTED BY TELEPHONE AND L. R. KERLING, DISASTER CHAIRMAN OF THE SARGENT COUNTY CHAPTER OF THE RED CROSS AND GILMAN KLEFSTAD, MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, DISCUSSED SNOW REMOVAL AND LIVESTOCK FEED MATTERS WITH HIM.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER MOVED THAT THE MEETING ADJOURN.
COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW.

ON ROLL CALL, COMMISSIONERS KIEFER, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD WERE FOUND PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN MARCH WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER SECONDED THE MOTION AND ON ROLL CALL ALL VOTED AYE, AND THE MOTION CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, DUE TO EXCESSIVE SNOW FALL DURING THE PAST MONTH, ALL COUNTY ROADS HAVE BECOME BLOCKED WHICH HAS CAUSED A SERIOUS CONDITION AND UNDUE HARDSHIPS AND SUFFERING IN CASES WHERE PEOPLE NEEDED TO BE TAKEN TO DOCTORS AND HOSPITALS, SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND FUEL AND FEED FOR LIVESTOCK, WITH EVERY INDICATION THAT HEAVY LOSSES OF LIVESTOCK WILL OCCUR IN THE EVENT OF MORE SNOW AND STORMS, AND

WHEREAS THE COUNTY HAS MADE EVERY POSSIBLE EFFORT TO OPEN UP THE ROADS WITH ITS OWN EQUIPMENT BUT HAS BEEN UNABLE TO DO SO FOR THE REASON THAT THE SAIDEQUIPMENT IS NOT HEAVY ENOUGH AND IN ORDER TO OPEN UP THE ROADS TO ALLEVIATE THE INCONVENIENCE OF THE PUBLIC AND THE SUFFERING OF LIVESTOCK IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO HIRE HEAVY ROAD EQUIPMENT, AND

WHEREAS THE PRESENT TAX LEVY LIMITATIONS DO NOT PERMIT THE COUNTY TO LEVY SUFFICIENT FUNDS TO CARE FOR EVEN THE NORMAL NEEDS OF THE COUNTY, AND THE COUNTY HAS AT THIS TIME NO UNENCUMBERED FUNDS AVAILABLE TO PAY FOR THE RENTAL OF EQUIPMENT FOR REMOVING THE SNOW OFF THE HIGHWAYS,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, THAT AN EMERGENCY BE DECLARED TO EXIST AND THAT THE SUM OF \$10,000.00 BE TRANSFERRED FROM THE COUNTY EMERGENCY FUND TO THE COUNTY ROAD FUND TO BE ALLOCATED IN THE SUM OF 2000.00 FOR EACH COMMISSIONERS DISTRICT, WHICH WOULD BE OF EQUAL DISTRIBUTION TO ALLEVIATE PRESENT CONDITIONS AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE IN THE COUNTY AS A WHOLE.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED, ALL VOTING AYE, AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, AS FOLLOWS:

THAT ALL COUNTY ROADS WITHIN THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, BE CLOSED TO ALL TRUCKS WHICH HAVE A GROSS WEIGHT OF 5 TONS OR OVER.

THAT SIGNS BE ERECTED ON ALL COUNTY ROADS ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 39-1203 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA REVISED CODE OF 1943, SAID SIGNS TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

WARNING - LOAD LIMIT.

ROAD CLOSED TO ALL TRUCKS OF 5TON GROSS WEIGHT OR OVER.

SARGENT COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

THAT THE FOREGOING WEIGHT RESTRICTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON THE POSTING OF SAID SIGNS AND REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THEY ARE REMOVED.

ANY PERSON VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND SHALL BE PUNISHED BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$100.00 OR IMPRISONEMENT IN THE COUNTY JAIL FOR NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS, OR BY BOTH SUCH FINE AND IMPRISONMENT.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED, ALL VOTING AYE, AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER DAWSON INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS SARGENT COUNTY IS SUBMITTING THE FOLLOWING FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT:

THE COUNTY HAS PREPARED THE FOLLOWING PROGRAM FOR SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF THE COUNTY IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 316 OF THE 1951 SESSION LAWS OF NORTH DAKOTA:

WHEREAS, SUCH DESIGNATION WILL REQUIRE THE APPROVAL BY THE COUNTY OF THE REVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY SYSTEM WITHIN THIS COUNTY,

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED THAT THIS COUNTY APPROVES THE DESIGNATION OF THE REVISIONS OF THE FEDERAL AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY SYSTEM AS SHOWN ON THE ATTACHED MAP AND DESCRIBED IN THE ATTACHED TABULATION INCLUDED IN THE RESOLUTION ENTERED ABOVE.

ON ROLL CALL ALL MEMBERS PRESENT VOTED IN FAVOR OF SAID RESOLUTION, AND THE SAME WAS DECLARED DULY CARRIED AND ADOPTED.



SAID NOXIOUS WEEDS SHALL BE DESTROYED BY SPRAYING WITH THE PROPER CHEMICALS AS APPROVED BY THE COUNTY AGENT OF SARGENT COUNTY, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS RESOLUTION BE PUBLISHED FOR AT LEAST TWO WEEKS IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, PURSUANT TO LAW, AND


