THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

A PETITION WAS RECEIVED BY THE BOARD SIGNED BY RESIDENT TAXPAYERS AND FREEHOLDERS IN WILLEY TOWNSHIP, ASKING THE BOARD TO FURNISH TWO 4 FT. CULVERT EXTENSIONS 36 INCH IN DIAMETER AND 2 BANDS TO BE USED ON ROAD BETWEEN SECTIONS 29 AND 32 IN WILLEY TOWNSHIP.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE PETITION BE ALLOWED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN APRIL WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE REPORT OF SHERIFF MILTON FAY, OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL BE APPROVED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$925.96.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE BID IN THE AMOUNT OF \$39,989.84 OF JOHN O. LIEN RECEIVED IN THE LETTING OF APRIL 26, 1957, FOR PROJECT S 113(2) - BRAMPTON NORTH TO COGSWELL - WAS THE LOW BID RECEIVED.

WHEREAS, THIS BID IS CONSIDERED REASONABLE AND IS UNDER THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE,  
NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT BE REQUESTED TO AWARD TO THE JOHN O. LIEN THE CONTRACT FOR PROJECT S 113(2) AND SECURE FEDERAL CONCURRENCE THEREOF.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD THAT THE COUNTY SHALL REIMBURSE THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR ANY PAYMENTS MADE UNDER THIS CONTRACT, WHICH ARE NOT COLLECTIBLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE MOVED THAT THE SURETY BOND OF GLOBE-GAZETTE PRINTING CO. FURNISHED IN CONNECTION WITH SAID COMPANY'S CONTRACT TO FURNISH BOOKS AND SUPPLIES FOR THE COUNTY FOR THE YEAR 1957, IN THE SUM OF \$1,000.00, WITH THE WESTERN SURETY COMPANY AS SURETY, AND HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY AS TO FORM, BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS TO SUFFICIENCY.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE BOARD ENTER INTO A CONTRACT TO LEASE THE SE $\frac{1}{4}$  OF SEC. 27-129-55 TO IRVING WEBER, AND THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND INSTRUCTED TO SIGN LEASE.  
COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.




