The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, October 15th at 9 a.m.. Commissioners present were Wade Anderson, Mark Breker, Jason Arth, Lyle Bopp and Chairman, Scott Johnson. Also in attendance were Tia Bopp, Auditor; Duane Peterson, Human Resources Director; Tim Faber, Road Supervisor; and Jerry Waswick, Gwinner resident.

Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion to accept the agenda as amended. (Anderson/Breker) Motion carried.

Motion to approve the minutes of the October 1st meeting. (Bopp/Arth) Motion carried.

Jerry Waswick was in attendance on behalf of the Gwinner Community Development Corporation (GCDC). The GCDC had purchased a trailer house on a sheriff's sale earlier this summer and were requesting an abatement of the taxes. J. Waswick stated that there were no utilities connected to the trailer and the same was not livable.

LaJuana Hayen, Tax Director, arrived at the meeting and stated that an abatement was not applicable because there were no more taxes due on the property and the GCDC was not the owner of the property in calendar year 2023 so they couldn't apply for the abatement. Additionally, the sheriff's deed transferring the property has not been recorded. The purchase price had been applied to all the back taxes.

States Attorney, Jayne Pfau arrived at the meeting at 9:11 a.m.

The intent is to remove the trailer from the property in Gwinner and ultimately convert it into a stage. It was agreed to table the matter until the second meeting in November to see if the trailer house had in fact been removed from the property before taking any action.

Dustin Hofland from Marshall County Highway Department had sent over a Memorandum of Understanding in regard to a bridge that is owned by Marshall County identified as bridge 46-141-000. Motion to sign Memorandum of Understanding with Marshall County. (Arth/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Bryce Carlson from the JDA was unable to attend the meeting. He will be invited to the next meeting.

Trent Mahler, Ambulance Coordinator, arrived at the meeting. T. Mahler was asked about the part-time assistant ambulance coordinator candidate if any discussion had transpired regarding benefits etc. T. Mahler indicated the applicant had submitted her application, but no other conversations had transpired. Duane Peterson, Human Resources Director, suggested that the county advertise for the position as a part-time position and work out the benefits portion after a candidate had been selected. Motion to advertise for a part-time assistant ambulance coordinator. (Breker/Anderson) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Discussion turned to reimbursement of the Gwinner First Responders. While the Commission feels the GFR are entitled to reimbursement, they would like the same to be postponed until next year when the reimbursement funds can be budgeted for.

The Red River Valley Water Supply Project Memorandum of Commitment was discussed. Motion to conditionally commit to 1 csf pending the outcome of Measure 4 during the General Election. If Measure 4 does not pass, the Commission will proceed with the commitment of 1 csf. (Anderson/Arth) Roll call vote was taken. Voting yes were: Arth, Anderson, Bopp and Johnson. Voting no was Breker. Motion carried.

The Commission reviewed the bills. Motion to approve the payroll in the amount of \$302,813.84 and the bills as presented. (Bopp/Arth) Upon roll call vote, motion passed unanimously. Anderson did not vote, he had stepped out of the room.

Motion to appoint Wade Anderson as the Commission delegate to the North Dakota State Fair's Annual Meeting. (Arth/Bopp). Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Motion to sign and pay Progressive Estimate No. 3 for the Courthouse Parking Lot Reconstruction and Lighting project. (Anderson/Arth) Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Road right-of-ways were discussed. The road department will look for any right of ways that are being used improperly and will bring the information back to the commission for discussion and next steps.

Commissioner Anderson brought up the condition of the health department building, It is getting to be a real safety concern and the commission needs to look at a resolution.

Discussion was held regarding some trucks that are transporting rocks that have been stopped and found to be overweight.

Motion to authorize the signing of a response letter to the NDDOT Highway/Rail Crossing Manager. (Bopp/Anderson). Upon roll call vote, motion carried unanimously.

Upcoming dates were discussed.

Tim Faber, Road Supervisor, asked whether truck speed limits had been set to 55 on paved roads. A review of last fall's minutes will be done to see what was determined last year.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:48.
