A petition for the incorporation of the Village of Cryswell, signed by H. L. Saylor, Thos. A. Staigh, J. H. Shannon, H. E. Shearn, L. H. White, and others, was presented to the Board.

The resolution was presented:-

Whereas, after a full hearing of the petition and application of H. L. Saylor, Thos. A. Staigh, J. H. Shannon, H. E. Shearn, L. H. White, and others for the incorporation of the Village of Cryswell, it appears to this Board that an accurate map and survey has been made of the territory described in such petition, and that such map and survey is duly verified by the affidavit of Thos. A. Staigh, County Surveyor; also that a census of all the residents of the territory included in said survey was made by Howard L. Saylor on the 18th day

of January, 1905, the same being verified by affidavit of the said Steward L. Saylor; and it also appearing that the said survey, map and census of the territory proposed to be incorporated has been exhibited at the post-office at Coyacull for a period of thirty days, the same being verified by affidavit of W. W. Prentice; and it appearing to the Board that the law, in such cases made and provided, has been fully complied with, it is hereby ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Sangre County, North Dakota that the territory described in said petition namely;

Beginning at an iron stake, twenty-two rods north, and twenty-two rods east of the north-east corner of Section two, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven; thence south on a line parallel to the section line between sections one and two, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven, to an iron post located on the quarter section line between the north-west quarter and the south west quarter of section one; thence west along the quarter section line to the quarter section corner between sections one and two; thence west along the quarter section line between the north east and the south east quarters of section two, to a point marking the center of said section; thence west along the quarter section line between the north west and the south west quarters of section two, a distance of twenty-two rods to an iron stake; thence north on a line parallel to the quarter section line between the north east and the north west quarters of section two to the Township line between section two, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven, and section thirty-five, Township one hundred and thirty-one, Range fifty-seven; thence north to an iron stake set twenty-two rods north of said Township line; thence east on a line parallel to the Township line between section two, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven, and section thirty-five, Township one hundred and thirty-one, Range fifty-seven

The quantity of land embraced in said territory, according to the survey thereof, is two hundred and thirty-two and seventy-three one hundredths acres, and the resident population contained in said territory, according to the census thereof, made on the 18th day of January, 1905, numbers two hundred and ninety-one persons.

The lands embraced in said proposed incorporation are described as follows:

All of the north east quarter of section two, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven, including all lots and blocks in the village of Coyseville, and additions thereto; a tract of land twenty-two rods square in the south west corner of the south west quarter of section thirty-six, Township one hundred and thirty-one Range fifty-seven; a tract of land twenty-two rods wide along the west side of the north west quarter of section one, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven; a tract of land twenty-two rods wide along the east side of the north west quarter of section two, Township one hundred and thirty, Range fifty-seven; a tract of land twenty-two rods square in the south east corner of the south west quarter of section thirty-five, Township one hundred and thirty-one Range fifty-seven; and a tract of land twenty-two rods wide along the south side of the south east quarter of section thirty-five, Township one hundred and thirty-one, Range fifty-seven, all of the above described lands, and lying within the beforemen- tioned boundaries, shall, with the assent of the qualified voters thereof, be an incorporated village by the name of Village of Coyseville. And it is hereby ordered that a meeting of the qualified voters residing in said proposed Village of Coyseville, be held at the office of J. H. Shannon, in the village of Coyseville, on the 15th day of

February 21st, 1905

March, 1905; to determine whether said described territory shall be an incorporated village, and the county auditor is hereby directed to cause notice of such meeting to be published in the Coxsack Enterprise, and to cause notices of same to be posted, as required by law.

Resolved; that the State Attorney be, and he is hereby instructed to notify all persons or firms in the county, known to be maintaining a nuisance, or otherwise violating the prohibition laws of State; to abate such nuisance at once, and to quit the business of selling intoxicating liquors; and it is hereby declared to be the sense of this board that they will aid and abet the authorities to the best of their ability in prosecuting such offenders, who may continue to violate the law after such notice.
