THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

ANSWERING ROLL CALL WERE COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BIDS OF DAKOTA TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT COMPANY AND MYHRA EQUIPMENT COMPANY TO FURNISH A MOTOR PATROL GRADER FOR RENTAL, WHICH BIDS WERE OPENED JUNE 9TH, BE REJECTED FOR NOT COMPLYING WITH SPECIFICATIONS AS ADVERTISED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A PETITION SIGNED BY FREEHOLDERS OF WEBER TOWNSHIP WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD. THIS PETITION ASKED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BRIDGE BETWEEN SECTIONS 21 AND 28 IN SAID TOWNSHIP.





THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET PURSUANT TO LAW, AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE.

PRESENT AND ANSWERING ROLL CALL WERE COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, KIEFER, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN JUNE WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE SURETY BOND OF THE SARGENT COUNTY FARMERS PUBLISHING COMPANY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,000.00 WITH THE WESTERN SURETY COMPANY AS SURETY, FURNISHED BY THE SARGENT COUNTY NEWS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ELECTION OF SAID PAPER AS OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF SARGENT COUNTY, SAME HAVING BEEN APPROVED AS TO FORM BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY, BE APPROVED AS TO SUFFICIENCY.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO CONSIDER BUDGET REQUESTS FILED BY THE VARIOUS COUNTY OFFICIALS FOR THE ENSUING FISCAL YEAR AND WERE SO OCCUPIED DURING THE ENTIRE DAY.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BOARD ADJOURN UNTIL 9 O'CLOCK, A. M. JULY 7, 1952.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

FORMAN, N. DAK. JULY 7, 1952.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT, EXCEPT COMMISSIONER DAWSON.

PRESENT AND ANSWERING ROLL CALL WERE COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, KIEFER, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO VIEW AND INSPECT CATTLE PASS IN HERMAN TOWNSHIP AND BRIDGES IN HERMAN, KINGSTON AND WEBER TOWNSHIP.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THE BOARD ADJOURN AS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS UNTIL JULY 9, 1952, AND PROCEED TO ORGANIZE AS BOARD OF REVIEW AND EQUALIZATION, AND THAT COMMISSIONER COLEMAN ACT AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF REVIEW AND EQUALIZATION.

COMMISSIONER KIEFER SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

ON MOTION R. W. SAFSTROM, COUNTY AUDITOR WAS APPOINTED CLERK AND SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF REVIEW AND EQUALIZATION.

THE OFFICIAL OATH OF OFFICE WAS ADMINISTERED TO THE MEMBERS IN DUE FORM AND ON MOTION THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO REVIEW AND EQUALIZE THE ASSESSMENT AS RETURNED BY THE ASSESSORS OF THE VARIOUS DISTRICTS OF THE COUNTY FOR THE YEAR 1952.

ON MOTION THE BOARD EXAMINED THE ASSESSORS BOOKS OF ASSESSMENT OF FARM LANDS AND VILLAGE LOTS INCLUDING STRUCTURES ON VILLAGE LOTS AND FOUND THAT THE ASSESSORS HAD COMPLIED WITH THE PROVISIONS OF CHAP. 57-0211, 1943 REVISED CODE, WHICH PROVIDES THAT REAL ESTATE, INCLUDING STRUCTURES, BE ASSESSED FOR THE EVEN NUMBERED YEARS AT THE SAME VALUE AS LEFT BY THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION FOR THE PRECEDING YEAR.

THE BOARD FOUND THAT SAID LAW HAD BEEN FULLY COMPLIED WITH; THAT NO ASSESSMENT HAD BEEN MADE EXCEPT SOME CHANGES MADE NECESSARY FOR THE REASON THAT IN SOME CASES STRUCTURES HAD EITHER BEEN ERECTED OR REMOVED OR DESTROYED SINCE THE LAST ASSESSMENT WAS MADE, AND IN SOME CASES PROPERTY WHICH PREVIOUSLY HAD BEEN OMITTED FROM TAXATION HAD BEEN ADDED.



THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE IN SPECIAL SESSION, CALLED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSIDERING PROPOSED LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11, AT THE REQUEST OF THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

ALL WERE PRESENT EXCEPT COMMISSIONER COLEMAN.

THE CHAIRMAN, COMMISSIONER MARQUETTE REPORTED THAT HE HAD RECEIVED A LETTER FROM MR. S. W. THOMPSON, STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER, ADVISING HIM THAT THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT IS READY TO PROCEED WITH THE SURVEY OF A NEW LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11 ON THE QUARTER LINE FROM A POINT ON STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11 AT THE SOUTH CITY LIMITS OF FORMAN AND EXTENDING DUE WEST A DISTANCE OF APPROXIMATELY 13 MILES.

THE LETTER FURTHER STATED THAT THE SURVEY COULD BE STARTED IN TWO WEEKS IF AN AGREEMENT COULD BE REACHED AS TO THE LOCATION OF THE ROAD AND DIVISION OF THE COSTS. IF SUCH AN AGREEMENT COULD NOT BE REACHED IMMEDIATELY, THE STATE SURVEYORS WOULD BE SENT ELSEWHERE AND NO SURVEY OF HIGHWAY 11 WOULD BE MADE IN 1953.

COMMISSIONER HOPFLEN MOVED THAT THE BOARD GO ON RECORD AS BEING IN FAVOR OF HAVING STATE HIGHWAY NO. 11 CONSTRUCTED ON THE QUARTER-LINE, ONE-HALF MILE SOUTH OF THE SOO LINE RAILROAD AND THAT THE BOARD AGREES TO PAY 50% OF RIGHT OF WAY COSTS.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A LETTER, WRITTEN BY THE CHAIRMAN, AND A COPY OF THE ABOVE MOTION ^{WERE} SENT TO MR. S. W. THOMPSON, STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BOARD ADJOURN.
COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.


CERTIFICATE OF COUNTY AUDITOR.
