COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

(FULL TEXT OF RESOLUTION APPEARS BELOW) COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPRAISE LANDS AND CITY AND VILLAGE LOTS WHICH HAD BEEN FORFEITED TO THE COUNTY FOR NON-PAYMENT OF TAXES, AND ON MOTION SAID APPRAISALS WERE APPROVED IN AMOUNTS SHOWN ON LIST WHICH WILL PE POSTED IN FRONT OF THE COURTHOUSE, Nov. 5, 1956, ACCORDING TO LAW AND THE TIME OF HEARING OB-JECTIONS TO THE MINIMUM SALE PRICE AGRED UPON, WAS SET AT 10 O'CLOCK, A. M., Nov. 2, 1956.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BOARD ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTH DAKOTA UN-EMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION DIVISION, FOR SOCIAL SECURITY COVERAGE FOR HATTIE COLBURN, COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF Schools, Retroactive as to Jan. 1, 1956, and that the Chairman of the Board be authorized and instructed to SIGN SAID AGREEMENT. (FULL TEXT OF AGREEMENT APPEARS BELOW)

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE QUARTERLY REPORT OF JUSTICES OF THE PEACE, WILLIAM S. KLUBBEN AND J. H. HOHAUS, FOR THE QUARTER ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1956, BE APPROVED, SAME HAVING BEEN APPROVED AS TO FORM BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH WATER CONSERVATION AND FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT ...

WHEREAS, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, DEEM IT ADVISABLE THAT A COUNTY WIDE FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, WHICH WOULD EMBRACE ALL OF SARGENT COUNTY, Morth Dakota, be established, and that said Board feels that there is a need for such district, and that THE COUNTY AS A WHOLE WOULD BENEFIT FROM THE ORGANIZATION OF SUCH A DISTRICT, AND

WHEREAS, THE PEOPLE OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, HAVE INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD LIKE THE STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO ESTABLISH SUCH A DISTRICT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, HAVE DETERMINED THAT IT IS DESIRABLE THAT A WATER CONSERVATION AND FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT, WHICH WOULD EMBRACE ALL OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA, BE ESTABLISHED, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AT-TACHED PETITION, SUCH DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AS THE "SARGENT COUNTY WATER CONSERVATION AND FLOOD CONTROL DIS-TRICT", IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS AND STATUTES FOR SUCH CASES MADE AND PROVIDED, AND THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE AUDITOR OF SARGENT COUNTY BE AND, THEY HEREBY ARE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO PREPARE AND EXECUTE SUCH A PETITION AND TO FILE THE SAME ALONG WITH A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION WITH THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE WATER COMMISSION.

AGREEMENT - COVERAGE OF STATE AND LOCAL EMPLOYEES

THE NORTH DAKOTA UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION DIVISION, HEREINAFTER CALLED THE STATE AGENCY AND BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, SARGENT COUNTY HEREBY AGREE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CONDITIONS STATEDIN THIS AGREEMENT AND SECTION 218 OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT, TO ACCEPT THE INSURANCE SYSTEM ESTABLISHED BY TITLE 11 of the Social Security Act, to services performed by individuals as employees of this coverage group, EXCEPT SERVICES EXPRESSLY EXCLUDED FROM THE AGREEMENT.

(A) DEFINITIONS.

FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PLAN--

- (1) THE TERM "EMPLOYEE" MEANS AN EMPLOYEE AS DEFINED IN SECTION 210(K) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT AND SHALL INCLUDE AN OFFICER OF THE STATE OR OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THEREOF IF COVERED BY THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
- (2) A "COVERAGE GROUP" MEANS A COVERAGE GROUP AS DEFINED IN SECTION 218(D)(4) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT.
 - (B) SERVICES COVERED.

THIS AGREEMENT INCLUDES AND IS LIMITED TO ALL SERVICES PERFORMED BY INDIVIDUALS AS EMPLOYEES OF THE COVERAGE GROUP INCLUDED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, EXCEPT:

- 1. (A) ANY SERVICE IN A POLICEMAN'S OR FIREMAN'S POSITION WHICH, ON THE DATE THIS AGREE-MENT IS MADE APPLICABLE TO THIS COVERAGE GROUP, IS COVERED BY A RETIREMENT SYSTEM; AND
- (B) ANY SERVICE PERFORMED BY AN EMPLOYEE IN A POSITION WHICH IS NOT A POLICEMAN'S OR FIREMAN'S POSITION AND WHICH, ON SEPTEMBER 1, 1954 WAS COVERED BY A RETIREMENT SYSTEM OTHER THAN--
- (1) SERVICE PERFORMED BY AN EMPLOYEE IN A POSITION WHICH IS INCLUDED IN A SEPARATE COVERAGE GROUP ESTABLISHED BY SECTION 218(D)(4) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT: OR MEMBER OF A COVERAGE GROUP (AS DEFINED IN SECTION 218 (B(5) OF THE ACT) WITH RESPECT TO WHICH THIS AGREEMENT IS IN EFFECT, IN A POBITION COVERED BY A RETIREMENT SYSTEM, IF THE INDIVIDUAL PERFORMING SUCH SERVICE 18 INELIGIBLE TO BECOME A MEMBER OF SUCH COVERAGE GROUP (OR, IF LATER, THE DATE ON WHICH SUCH INDIVIDUAL FIRST OCCUPIES SUCH POSITION).
 - 2. SERVICE PERFORMED BY AN EMPLOYEE WHO IS EMPLOYED TO RELIEVE HIM FROM UNEMPLOYMENT.
 - SERVICE PERFORMED IN A HOSPITAL, HOME OR OTHER INSTITUTION BY AN IMMATE THEREOF.

 COVERED TRANSPORTATION SERVICE (AS DEFINED IN SECTION 210(A) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT,

AND 5. Service (other than agricultural Labor or Service performed by a Student) excluded from SECTION.

EMPLOYMENT BY ANY PROVISIONS OF SECTION 210(A) OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT, OTHER THAN PARAGRAPH (8) OF SUCH

(C) CONTRIBUTIONS.

EACH SUBDIVISION OF THE COVERAGE GROUP WILL PAY TO THE STATE AGENCY, AT SUCH TIME OR TIMES AS THE STATE AGENCY MAY PRESCRIBE, THE TAXES IMPOSED UNDER THE STATE ENABLING LEGISLATION CHAPTER 306SL55. FUNDS FOR PAYMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS HAVE BEEN AND WILL BE PROVIDED FROM COUNTY GENERAL FUND. IN ADDITION TO THE PAYROLL TAX IMPOSED, THE SUBDIVISION AGREES TO PAY ITS SHARE OF THE COST OF ADMINISTRATION AS DETERMINED DUE BY THE STATE AGENCY.

(D) Compliance with REGULATIONS OF THE STATE AGENCY.

THE COVERAGE GROUP WILL COMPLY WITH ALL REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE STATE AGENCY, AND THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND WELFARE TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF SECTION 218 OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT.

(E) MODIFICATION.

THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE MODIFIED AT THE REQUEST OF THE COVERAGE GROUP TO INCLUDE SERVICES NOT NOW INCLUDED IN THIS AGREEMENT, SUCH MODIFICATION TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 218 OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT.

(F) TERMINATION BY THE COVERAGE GROUP.

UPON GIVING AT LEAST TWO YEARS ADVANCE NOTICE IN WRITING TO THE STATE AGENCY THE COVERAGE GROUP MAY TERMINATE THIS AGREEMENT, HOWEVER, THE COVERAGE GROUP MAY NOT SERVE NOTICE OF ITS DESIRE TO TERMI-NATE UNTIL THE AGREEMENT HAS BEEN IN EFFECT FOR FIVE YEARS.

(G) TERMINATION BY THE STATE AGENCY.

IF THE STATE AGENCY FINDS THAT THE COVERAGE GROUP HAS FAILED OR 18 NO LONGER LEGALLY ABLE TO COMPLY SUBSTANTIALLY WITH ANY PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT OR OF SECTION 218 OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT, IT SHALL NOTIFY THE COVERAGE GROUP BY GIVING NOTIFICATION IN WRITING TO THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COVERAGE GROUP THAT THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE TERMINATED IN ITS ENTIRETY, AT SUCH TIME DESIGNATED, IN, BUT NOT EARLIER THAN TWO YEARS FROM THE DATE OF SUCH NOTIFICATION UNLESS PRIOR TO SUCH TIME HE FINDS THAT THE CAUSE FOR SUCH LEGAL INABILITY HAS BEEN REMOVED. THE STATE AGENCY SHALL NOT FINALLY TERMINATE AN APPROVED PLAN WITHOUT NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING TO THE COVERAGE GROUP. IF UNDER THIS PART OR PART (F), AN AGREEMENT IS TERMINATED WITH RESPECT TO THE COVERAGE GROUP, SUCH TERMINATION SHALL BE EFFECTIVE ALSO WITH RESPECT TO ANY ADDITIONAL SERVICES IN SUCH COVERAGE GROUP INCLUDED IN THE AGREEMENT PURSUANT TO ANY MODIFICATION THEREOF UNDER PART (E). IF A COVERAGE GROUP HAS BEEN TERMINATED AT ITS OWN REQUEST OR BY ACTION OF THE STATE AGENCY THE COVERAGE GROUP MAY NOT AGAIN ENTER AN AGREEMENT FOR SOCIAL SECURITY COVERAGE.

- (H) ADJUSTMENTS, REFUNDS, AND INTEREST ON DELINQUENT PAYMENTS.
- (1) IF MORE OR LESS THAN THE CORRECT AMOUNT DUE UNDER PART (C) OF THIS AGREEMENT IS PAID PROPER ADJUSTMENTS WITH RESPECT TO THE AMOUNTS DUE THEREUNDER, SHALL BE MADE.

(2) IF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION DOES NOT MAKE THE PAYMENTS WHEN DUE, THERE SHALL BE ADDED, INTEREST AT THE RATE OF SIX PERCENTUM PER ANNUM FROM THE DUE DATE UNTIL PAID. THE STATE AGENCY MAY TAKE ANY ACTION TO COLLECT DELINQUENT TAXES. THE COVERAGE GROUP AGREES TO PERMIT DELINQUENT TAXES TO BE DE-DUCTED FROM ANY MONIES DUE FROM THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA.

(1) ADMINISTRATION.

THE ADMINISTRATION FOR THE COVERAGE GROUP OF THIS PLAN OF OPERATION SHALL BE DELEGATED TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR.

(J) EFFECTIVE DATE.

THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE EFFECTIVE AS OF JAN. 1, 1956. THIS IS TO CERTIFY THAT THE GOVERNING BOARD HAS APPROVED THIS AGREEMENT BY OFFICIAL ACTION DURING A REGULAR MEETING AND THAT THE APPROVAL AND AGREEMENT ARE A PART OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING.
