

FORMAN, N. DAK. AUGUST 6, 1957.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN JULY WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE REPORT OF SHERIFF MILTON FAY OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF JULY BE APPROVED IN THE SUM OF \$965.00.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT DEED BE ISSUED TO CLYDE & MURIEL COLBERT, COVERING LOTS 5 & 6, BLOCK 17, 1ST ADDITION, CITY OF FORMAN, SAME HAVING BEEN REPURCHASED BY SAID PARTIES, THE FORMER OWNERS, FOR A CONSIDERATION OF \$100.00; TERMS CASH.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE BOARD ENTER INTO THE FOLLOWING AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT:

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE DEPARTMENT, AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE DEPARTMENT WILL TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TOWARD SECURING COOPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXTENT PROVIDED IN THE FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY ACT OF 1944, OR OTHER SUBSEQUENT FEDERAL-AID HIGHWAY ACTS, WHICH AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CONTINUING THE CONSTRUCTION OF HIGHWAYS ON THE COUNTY FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY SYSTEM, FOR THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY PROJECT No. S 113(3) GRAVEL SURFACING ON A COUNTY ROAD FROM COGSWELL TO BRAMPTON.

2. THE COUNTY WILL PAY ALL CONSTRUCTION COSTS EXCEPT THE AMOUNT PAID BY THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT THROUGH THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AND, IF THE DEPARTMENT ADVANCES ANY PAYMENT IN BEHALF OF THE COUNTY TO THE CONTRACTOR OR ANY OTHER PARTIES WHICH ARE LATER FOUND NON COLLECTABLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS, THE COUNTY WILL REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR FUNDS SO ADVANCED. THE TERM "CONSTRUCTION" MEANS THE SUPERVISING, INSPECTING, ACTUAL BUILDING AND ALL EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THE CONSTRUCTION OR RECONSTRUCTION OF THE HIGHWAY INCLUDING LOCATING, SURVEYING, MAPPING, COSTS OF RIGHTS-OF-WAY, COSTS OF ADVERTISING AND THE COST OF ALL OTHER WORK NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE PROJECT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

3. THE COUNTY AGREES TO MAKE BINDING AND A PART OF THIS AGREEMENT ALL PROVISION OF RESOLUTIONS EXECUTED BY THE COUNTY AFFECTING THIS PROJECT OR RELATING TO THE MAINTENANCE OF ANY PORTION OF THE COUNTY'S FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY SYSTEM.

4. THE COUNTY WILL, AT ITS EXPENSE AND WITHOUT FEDERAL-AID REIMBURSEMENT, ACQUIRE THE NECESSARY RIGHTS-OF WAY.

5. ADEQUATE ENGINEERING, SUPERVISION AND INSPECTION SHALL BE PROVIDED BY THE COUNTY UNDER THE GENERAL DIRECTION AND CONTROL OF THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE COUNTY SHALL MAKE SUCH REPORTS, KEEP SUCH RECORDS AND PERFORM SUCH WORK IN THE MANNER AND TIME AS THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUEST AND DIRECT SO AS TO ENABLE THE DEPARTMENT, AS THE AGENT OF THE COUNTY, TO COLLECT FOR THE COUNTY THE FEDERAL-AID EARNED.

6. REQUIRED TESTS OF ALL MATERIALS ENTERING INTO THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROJECT SHALL BE MADE BY OR UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT TESTING LABORATORY. IT IS THE COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF SAMPLES ARE TAKEN IN A SATISFACTORY MANNER AND PROPERLY SUBMITTED FOR TESTING.

7. FEDERAL FUNDS WILL ONLY PARTICIPATE IN WORK PERFORMED SUBSEQUENT TO AUTHORIZATION BY THE DISTRICT ENGINEER OF THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AND THE DEPARTMENT.

8. AN ENGINEERING AND CLERICAL CHARGE OF 1% OF THE TOTAL COST OF THE PROJECT WILL BE MADE BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WHICH THE COUNTY AGREES TO PAY UPON COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN THIS AGREEMENT. COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE BOARD ENTER INTO THE FOLLOWING AGREEMENT:

THE COUNTY OF SARGENT, STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE COUNTY, AND THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT WILL SUBMIT A PROJECT FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 8.023 MILES OF THE COUNTY FEDERAL-AID SECONDARY HIGHWAY, GRAVEL ON A Co. Rd. FROM COGSWELL TO BRAMPTON, AND TO BE DESIGNATED AS NORTH DAKOTA PROJECT No. S 113(3), AND WILL RECOMMEND ITS APPROVAL BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA FOR CONSTRUCTION WITH FUNDS APPORTIONED TO THE STATE UNDER THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ACT AS AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED; SUBJECT, HOWEVER, TO THE CONDITION THAT THE COUNTY SHALL PROVIDE FOR ITS PROPER MAINTENANCE AFTER COMPLETION OF ITS IMPROVEMENT.

2. THAT THE SAID COUNTY HEREBY REQUESTS THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT THE AFOREMENTIONED PROJECT WITH RECOMMENDATION THAT IT BE APPROVED BY THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND AGREES THAT IF SUCH PROJECT IS APPROVED AND CONSTRUCTED BY THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, IT THEREAFTER, AT ITS OWN COST AND EXPENSE, WILL MAINTAIN THE PROJECT IN A MANNER SATISFACTORY TO THEM OR THEIR AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES, AND WILL MAKE AMPLE PROVISION EACH YEAR FOR SUCH MAINTENANCE.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND COUNTY AUDITOR ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND INSTRUCTED TO SIGN SAID AGREEMENT. COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A NUMBER OF APPLICATIONS FOR CORRECTION OF LAND ASSESSMENT, SIGNED BY LAND OWNERS IN FORMAN TOWNSHIP HAD BEEN FILED WITH THE BOARD.

THESE APPLICANTS PRAYED THAT THE INCREASE IN THE VALUATION OF THEIR LAND, ORDERED BY THE FORMAN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF REVIEW AND EQUALIZATION AT ITS MEETING ON JUNE 10, 1957, BE CORRECTED AND THE INCREASED VALUATIONS OF THEIR LAND BE REDUCED TO THE AMOUNTS PLACED ON THE LANDS BY THE ASSESSOR BEFORE THE BOARD ORDERED THE INCREASES.

THE APPLICANTS REQUESTED THE CANCELLATION OF THESE INCREASES FOR THE REASON THAT NO NOTICE WAS GIVEN THE LAND OWNERS OF THE BOARD'S INTENTION TO RAISE THE VALUATIONS AS REQUIRED BY SEC. 57-0904, 1943 REVISED CODE, AND THAT THIS OMISSION RESULTED IN AN UNFAIR, UNJUST AND INEQUITABLE ASSESSMENT.

ALL OF THE APPLICATIONS HAD BEEN APPROVED BY THE FORMAN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN AUGUST WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED AS READ.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE REPORT OF SHERIFF MILTON FAY, OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF AUGUST BE APPROVED IN THE SUM OF \$1,637.39.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:
WHEREAS, THE BID IN THE AMOUNT OF \$19,419.13 OF TENNEFOS CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC., RECEIVED IN THE LETTING OF AUGUST 23, 1957, FOR PROJECT S 113(3), (COGSWELL TO BRAMPTON ROAD) WAS THE LOW BID RECEIVED, AND WHEREAS, THIS BID IS CONSIDERED REASONABLE AND IS UNDER THE ENGINEER'S ESTIMATE,
NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT BE REQUESTED TO AWARD TO THE TENNEFOS CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. THE CONTRACT FOR PROJECT S 113(3) AND SECURE FEDERAL CONCURRENCE THEREOF.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD THAT THE COUNTY SHALL REIMBURSE THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR ANY PAYMENTS MADE UNDER THIS CONTRACT, WHICH ARE NOT COLLECTIBLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS.
COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.
