THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT.

ON ROLL CALL ALL COMMISSIONERS ANSWERED PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

A DELEGATION FROM HAVANA MET WITH THE BOARD AND FILED A PETITION ASKING FOR THE REPAIR OF HAVANA TILE DRAIN No. 19.

COMMISSIONER DAMSON MOVED THAT THE PETITION OF THE HAVANA DELEGATION BE APPROVED, AND THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE DIRECTED TO PUBLISH NOTICE IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER ASKING FOR SEALED BIDS FOR THE REPAIRING BY THE HOUR OR BY THE CUBIC YARD OF HAVANA TILE DRAIN No. 19, INCLUDING MATERIAL SUCH AS GLAZED TILE. BIDS TO BE OPENED OCT. 7, AT 10 O'CLOCK, A. M.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO APPROVE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO OPEN BIDS FOR THE REPAIRING OF BRIDGES AND CONSTRUCTION OF A BOX CULVERT AS ADVERTISED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT.

PRESENT AND ANSWERING ROLL CALL WERE COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, KIEFER, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD.

A PETITION SIGNED BY RESIDENTS OF BOWEN TOWNSHIP WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD. THIS PETITION REQUESTED THE BOARD TO CHANGE THE VOTING PLACE IN SAID TOWNSHIP FROM BOWEN SCHOOL No. 1 TO BOWEN SCHOOL No. 3.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE ABOVE PETITION BE GRANTED AND THAT BOWEN SCHOOL No. 3, LOCATED IN THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 30, BE DESIGNATED AS THE LEGAL VOTING PLACE FOR BOWEN TOWNSHIP.
COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH PEDER GJERTSON FOR THE REPAIR OF A BRIDGE IN SECTION 23-131-53, AND TO SIGN THE SAME.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE INSTRUCTED TO PUBLISH NOTICE IN THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER, CALLING FOR SEALED BIDS FOR THE FURNISHING AND HAULING OF COAL FOR THE COUNTY FOR THE ENSUING YEAR, BIDS TO BE OPENED OCT. 7, 1952, AT 2 O'CLOCK, P. M.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE COUNTY SELL CERTIFICATES OF INDEBTEDNESS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000.00 TO SARGENT COUNTY BANK, AND THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD AND THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO SIGN THE SAME. RATE OF INTEREST TO BE ~~3%~~.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA AS

FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS SAID BOARD HAS PREPARED A PROPOSED COUNTY CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM OF FARM TO MARKET AND FEDERAL AID ROADS, SETTING FORTH A GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE ROADS TO BE CONSTRUCTED, THE LOCATION OF THE BRIDGES CONSTITUTING A PART OF THE PROGRAM, THE APPROXIMATE TOTAL MILEAGE AND THE PRIORITY OF CONSTRUCTION, AND

WHEREAS, SAID PROGRAM HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS AS FOLLOWS:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT SAID PROGRAM BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS OF SARGENT COUNTY, ALONG WITH THE QUESTION OF LEVYING A TAX OF NOT TO EXCEED FIVE (5) MILLS ANNUALLY UNTIL THE ENTIRE PROGRAM IS COMPLETED, UPON THE NET TAXABLE ASSESSED VALUATION OF ALL THE PROPERTY IN THE COUNTY FOR THE COMPLETION OF SAID PROGRAM BY MATCHING FROM THE PROCEEDS OF SUCH TAX, FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR FEDERAL AID, SECONDARY AND FEEDER ROADS, FARM TO MARKET ROADS, AND ALL ROADS AS PROVIDED FOR UNDER PUBLIC LAW 769, 81ST CONGRESS OR FUTURE FEDERAL AID HIGHWAY ACTS OF SIMILAR CHARACTER, ALL IN CONFORMITY WITH CHAPTER 316 OF THE 1951 SESSION LAWS OF NORTH DAKOTA.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT SAID QUESTIONS SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS AT THE NOVEMBER, 1952 GENERAL ELECTION AND THAT THE COUNTY AUDITOR BE AUTHORIZED AND INSTRUCTED TO PLACE SAID QUESTIONS ON THE BALLOT.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND ON ROLL CALL COMMISSIONERS COLEMAN, MARQUETTE AND WALSTEAD VOTED AYE. COMMISSIONERS DAMSON AND KIEFFER VOTED NAY. MOTION CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.


