THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO LAW, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN SEPTEMBER WERE READ.
COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

ON MOTION THE BOARD APPROVED THE REPORT OF SHERIFF GORDON STEWART, OF DELINQUENT PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES COLLECTED DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER IN THE SUM OF \$1,200.76.

AN APPLICATION HAD BEEN FILED BY THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD CHURCH IN FORMAN, FOR AN ABATEMENT OF TAXES FOR THE YEAR 1952 IN THE SUM OF \$2.04, ON LOT 16, BLOCK 35, 1ST ADDITION, TOWN OF FORMAN.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE ABOVE APPLICATION BE ALLOWED FOR THE REASON THAT THE SAID LOT WAS OWNED BY THE CHURCH PRIOR TO THE 1952 ASSESSMENT, AND NOT SUBJECT TO TAXATION.

COMMISSIONER SMITH MOVED THAT THE BOARD APPROVE AND ACCEPT THE JOB OF CLEANING OUT THE CRETE-COGSWELL DRAIN No. 11, BETWEEN SECTIONS 23 AND 26 IN JACKSON TOWNSHIP, SAID WORK HAVING BEEN DONE BY T. W. ABRAHAM. ^{Repairing}

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO OPEN AND CONSIDER BIDS FOR THE FURNISHING OF LIGNITE COAL TO THE COUNTY FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AS ADVERTISED.

A BID HAD BEEN FILED BY THE FARMERS CO-OP. ELEVATOR CO.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BID OF THE FARMERS CO-OP. ELEVATOR COMPANY, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6.50 PER TON FOR 6 INCH LIGNITE COAL AND \$6.25 PER TON FOR LIGNITE STOKER COAL, F. O. B., FORMAN, BE ACCEPTED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD NEXT PROCEEDED TO OPEN AND CONSIDER BIDS FOR THE HAULING OF COAL FOR THE COUNTY FOR THE ENSUING YEAR AS ADVERTISED.

BIDS HAD BEEN FILED BY L. F. BERGH AND JAMES SCHILLER.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE BID OF JAMES SCHILLER IN THE SUM OF \$1.50 PER TON FOR HAULING COAL BE ACCEPTED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

A LETTER FROM THE STATE EXAMINER, J. A. GRAHAM, IN REGARD TO THE SAID REPORT WAS ALSO READ BY THE BOARD. THE LETTER WAS DULY CONSIDERED BY THE BOARD AND STEPS WERE TAKEN TO COMPLY WITH THE RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE LETTER.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT ALL DEPUTY OFFICIALS BE BONDED AS SUGGESTED BY THE STATE EXAMINER.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT THE BOARD ADJOURN TO 9 O'CLOCK, A. M., OCT. 7, 1953. COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

CHAIRMAN MARQUETTE INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA AS

FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, IT HAS COME TO THE ATTENTION OF THE SAID BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT CERTAIN INTERESTS HAVE ATTEMPTED TO INFLUENCE THE STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT IN RE-ROUTING STATE HIGHWAY #13 FROM MILNOR, NORTH DAKOTA, TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH STATE HIGHWAY #1, FROM ITS PRESENT COURSE TO A COURSE WHICH WOULD FOLLOW THE SARGENT-RANSOM COUNTY LINE, AND

WHEREAS, IT IS THE OPINION OF SAID BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT STATE HIGHWAY #13 SHOULD REMAIN AT ITS PRESENT LOCATION FROM MILNOR, NORTH DAKOTA TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH STATE HIGHWAY #1, SIX MILES NORTH OF OAKES, NORTH DAKOTA, FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

FOR THE REASON THAT SARGENT COUNTY HAS THREE FARM TO MARKET ROADS LEADING UP TO AND CONNECTING WITH STATE HIGHWAY #13 AND STATE HIGHWAY #13 IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM AND A PROGRAM WHEREBY STATE HIGHWAY #13 WOULD BE RE-ROUTED AS SHOWN ABOVE WOULD SERIOUSLY INJURE THE SAID COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM, AND

FOR THE REASON THAT STATE HIGHWAY #13 AT ITS PRESENT LOCATION DIRECTLY SERVES THE SARGENT COUNTY TOWNS OF GWINNER, STIRUM AND CRETE, AND THAT IT WOULD NOT BE FAIR TO DEPRIVE SAID TOWNS OF THIS SERVICE; AND THAT IF STATE HIGHWAY #13 WERE RE-ROUTED ALONG THE SARGENT-RANSOM COUNTY LINE, NO TOWNS WOULD BE DIRECTLY SERVED THEREBY

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, GO ON RECORD AS VEHEMENTLY PROTESTING SAID PROPOSED RE-ROUTING OF STATE HIGHWAY #13 AND THE SAID BOARD GO ON RECORD URGING THAT SAID HIGHWAY #13 REMAIN AT ITS PRESENT LOCATION.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE SENT TO THE HONORABLE NORMAN BRUNSDALE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA AND MR. S. W. THOMPSON, STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.





THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO CALL BY THE CHAIRMAN WHO HAD CALLED THE MEETING FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING ARRANGEMENTS TO MEET THE SITUATION CAUSED BY THE BOILER IN THE COURTHOUSE FURNACE SPRINGING A LEAK.

ON ROLL CALL ALL COMMISSIONERS WERE FOUND PRESENT.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT ALL COMMISSIONERS WAIVE THE TEN DAY NOTICE REQUIRED BY LAW FOR SPECIAL MEETINGS.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, A LEAK HAS BEEN DISCOVERED IN A CERTAIN STEAM BOILER NOW BEING USED AS A PART OF THE HEATING SYSTEM IN THE SARGENT COUNTY COURT HOUSE, IT HAS BECOME NECESSARY TO REPLACE SAME FOR THE REASON THAT IT IS NOT SAFE TO OPERATE AND THAT IT IS DOUBTFUL THAT A SATISFACTORY REPAIR CAN BE MADE ACCORDING TO THE REPORT OF VERNE W. ENGER, ENGINEER AND INSPECTOR FOR THE FIDELITY AND CASUALTY COMPANY OF NEW YORK AND OTHER INSURANCE COMPANIES, AND


COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

THE PROPERTY SO REMOVED FROM THE TAX ROLLS IS DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

LOT 3 & NE $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SE $\frac{1}{4}$ & NE $\frac{1}{4}$ IN SECTION 35 & 20 ACRES ON SOUTH SIDE OF THE S $\frac{1}{2}$ OF S $\frac{1}{2}$ OF S $\frac{1}{2}$ OF SECTION 26, ALL IN TOWNSHIP 130, RANGE 54, LAKE TRAVERSE LANDS, AND

WHEREAS: A CERTAIN PORTION OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PREMISES WAS NOT INUNDATED AND IS NOT INUNDATED AT THE PRESENT TIME; AND

WHEREAS: SECTION 57-0210 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA REVISED CODE OF 1943 PROVIDES THAT A BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ARE AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO REMOVE FROM THE TAX ROLLS AND DECLARE AS EXEMPT FROM TAXATION ALL INUNDATED LANDS UPON WHICH THE OWNERS THEREOF HAS GRANTED OR SHALL HEREAFTER GRANT A PERMANENT EASEMENT TO THE UNITED STATES, ITS INSTRUMENTALITIES AND AGENCIES FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, MAINTAINING AND OPERATING WILDLIFE CONSERVATION PROJECTS; AND

WHEREAS: A BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS HAS NO AUTHORITY TO REMOVE LANDS NOT INUNDATED FROM THE TAX ROLLS UNDER SUCH CIRCUMSTANCES; AND THAT THE JAN. 9TH, 1936 RESOLUTION ABOVE REFERRED TO WAS ILLEGAL IN THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS DID NOT HAVE AUTHORITY TO REMOVE LAND NOT INUNDATED FROM THE TAX ROLLS, AND

WHEREAS: THE OWNERS OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PROPERTY GRANTED EASEMENTS AS SHOWN ABOVE TO THE UNITED STATES IN CONSIDERATION OF FUTURE NON-ASSESSMENT AND NON-LEVY OF TAXES AGAINST ALL OF SAID DESCRIBED PROPERTY,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE JANUARY 9TH, 1936 RESOLUTION ABOVE REFERRED TO BE RESCINDED INsofar AS ITS PURPORTS TO REMOVE LANDS NOT INUNDATED FROM THE TAX ROLLS; AND THAT ONLY THAT PART OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PROPERTY THAT IS INUNDATED SHALL HENCEFORTH BE REMOVED FROM THE TAX ROLLS AND BE DECLARED EXEMPT FROM TAXATION, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT SUCH LAND NOT INUNDATED SHALL BE PLACED ON THE TAX ROLLS FOR THE YEAR 1951 AND SUBSEQUENT YEARS AND TAXED AS OTHER LAND, AND

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE UNITED STATES FISH AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION BE REQUESTED TO CANCEL THE EASEMENTS THAT IT NOW HOLDS, ON THE PART OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PROPERTY THAT IS NOT INUNDATED, FOR THE REASON, THAT THE OWNERS OF THE PROPERTY AT THE TIME THE EASEMENTS WERE GRANTED, GRANTED SUCH EASEMENTS UPON THE CONSIDERATION THAT SUCH PROPERTY WOULD BE REMOVED FROM THE TAX ROLLS."

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED. ON ROLL CALL, ALL COMMISSIONERS VOTED AYE AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE BOARD APPROVE AN APPLICATION MADE BY TEMAUKON TOWNSHIP BOARD THAT THE COUNTY TREASURER BE AUTHORIZED TO ACCEPT THE ORIGINAL AMOUNT OF TAXES FOR THE YEARS 1951 AND 1952 ON LAND WHICH HAS HERETOFORE NOT BEEN TAXED FOR THE REASON THAT SUCH LAND HAS BEEN CONSIDERED INUNDATED AND TO REFUND ANY INTEREST AND PENALTY ON SUCH LAND FOR SAID YEARS, WHICH MIGHT HAVE BEEN PAID.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

DIESEL MOTOR GRADER, COMPLETE WITH ATTACHMENTS, V TYPE SNOWPLOW, 12 FT. WING, 11 1/2 FT. MOULDBOARD, STEEL CAB, CAB HEATER, ELECTRIC LIGHT SYSTEM, POWER STEER AND ELEVATOR GRADER ATTACHMENT. BIDS TO BE OPENED AT 11 O'CLOCK, A. M., JANUARY 6, 1954.
