

FORMAN, N. DAK. JULY 27, 1954.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE IN SPECIAL SESSION, CALLED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF INSTITUTING CONDEMNATION PROCEEDINGS ON PROJECT F-191 (HIGHWAY NO. 13, GWINNER-MILNOR), AND TO PAY ESTIMATE NO. 2 ON PROJECT S 685(1) AND TO TRANSACT OTHER BUSINESS, PERTAINING TO HIGHWAYS.

ALL MEMBERS OF THE BOARD WERE PRESENT.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT ALL MEMBERS OF THE BOARD WAIVE THE 10 DAYS NOTICE OF TIME FOR THE MEETING, REQUIRED BY LAW.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER SMITH INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER HAVING FILED WITH THE COUNTY AUDITOR A PETITION, REQUESTING THAT THIS BOARD ASCERTAIN AND DETERMINE THE DAMAGES TO AND MAKE AWARD THEREFOR, CERTAIN TRACTS OF LAND WITHIN THIS COUNTY REQUIRED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, IMPROVEMENT AND ALIGNMENT OF WHAT IS KNOWN AS PROJECT F-191 (STATE HIGHWAY NO. 13, GWINNER-MILNOR), UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 24-0119 OF THE 1953 SUPPLEMENT OF THE N. D. REVISED CODE OF 1943, AND IT BEING NECESSARY TO FIX A DATE AND PLACE OF HEARING ON SAID PETITION, AT WHICH TIME AND PLACE THE AWARDS OF SAID DAMAGES MAY BE MADE AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

BE IT THEREFORE, RESOLVED THAT A MEETING OF THE BOARD FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASCERTAINING AND DETERMINING SAID DAMAGES AND MAKING AWARDS THEREFOR TO THE PERSONS ENTITLED THERETO BE HELD AT THE COURT HOUSE IN THE CITY OF FORMAN, THIS COUNTY, AT THE HOUR OF 10 O'CLOCK, A. M., ON THE 16TH DAY OF AUGUST, 1954, AND THAT PUBLISHED NOTICE OF SAID MEETING BE GIVEN AS PROVIDED BY SAID SECTION 24-0119 OF THE 1953 SUPPLEMENT OF THE N. D. REVISED CODE OF 1943.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE BID IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,250.41 OF E. L. LIEN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY RECEIVED IN THE LETTING OF JULY 23, 1954, FOR GRADE ON PROJECT S 217(2) WAS THE LOW BID RECEIVED, AND

WHEREAS THIS BID IS CONSIDERED REASONABLE AND IS UNDER THE ENGINEERS ESTIMATE,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT BE REQUESTED TO AWARD TO THE E. L. LIEN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY THE CONTRACT FOR PROJECT S 217(2) AND SECURE FEDERAL CONCURRENCE THEREOF.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD THAT THE COUNTY SHALL REIMBURSE THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR ANY PAYMENTS MADE UNDER THIS CONTRACT, WHICH ARE NOT COLLECTIBLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED AND THE RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE BID IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,966.43 OF TENNEFOS CONSTRUCTION CO., RECEIVED IN THE LETTING OF JULY 23, 1954, FOR GRAVEL ON PROJECT S 217(2) WAS THE LOW BID RECEIVED, AND

WHEREAS, THIS BID IS CONSIDERED REASONABLE AND IS UNDER THE ENGINEERS ESTIMATE,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SARGENT COUNTY, THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT BE REQUESTED TO AWARD TO THE TENNEFOS CONSTRUCTION COMPANY THE CONTRACT FOR PROJECT S 217(2) AND SECURE FEDERAL CONCURRENCE THEREOF.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD THAT THE COUNTY SHALL REIMBURSE THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR ANY PAYMENTS MADE UNDER THIS CONTRACT, WHICH ARE NOT COLLECTIBLE FROM THE BUREAU OF PUBLIC ROADS.



THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS HELD IN JULY WERE READ.

COMMISSIONER COLEMAN MOVED THAT THE MINUTES BE APPROVED AS READ.
COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

THE RESIGNATION OF GORDON STEWART AS SHERIFF OF THE COUNTY WAS RECEIVED BY THE BOARD.

COMMISSIONER HOFLEN MOVED THAT THE RESIGNATION OF MR. STEWART BE ACCEPTED AS OF JULY 31ST, 1954.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

COMMISSIONER WALSTEAD MOVED THAT L. R. KERLING BE APPOINTED SHERIFF TO FILL THE VACANCY CAUSED BY THE RESIGNATION OF GORDON STEWART, THIS APPOINTMENT TO BE EFFECTIVE AS OF AUGUST 1, 1954.

COMMISSIONER SMITH SECONDED THE MOTION AND SAME CARRIED.

PETITIONS WERE RECEIVED BY THE BOARD SIGNED BY RESIDENTS AND ELECTORS OF BOWEN SCHOOL DISTRICT, PETITIONING FOR THE ATTACHMENT OF PART OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT TO WINNER SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND A PART OF SAID DISTRICT TO FORMAN SPECIAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, SAID PETITIONS HAVING BEEN APPROVED BY THE NORTH DAKOTA STATE COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT REORGANIZATION.




