The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. with the following members present: Steve Wyum, Bill Smith, Ray Brockman, Donald Wehlander and Karen Anderson. Absent none.

Chuck Gates reported on the upcoming trial regarding Jesse Seelye, which is scheduled for August 6 in the Sargent County Courthouse.

Bill Anderson, Chairman, Planning Commission, met with the Board to explain the conditional application agreement presented by R.E.T. Smith, Attorney for Dakota Landfill regarding the application for an expansion of the present landfill site. The county ordinance does apply for anything that was not in use as landfill prior to the adoption of the county ordinance. There was 32 acres in use at the time and any additional acres must go through the application process. If the county executes this agreement, Dakota Landfill will submit an application for expansion. Lyle Bopp arrived at the meeting to add further comments to the agreement. Execute this conditional application agreement between Sargent County and Big Dipper Enterprises, Inc. (Wyum/Anderson. Roll call: Yes: Anderson, Brockman, Smith, Wyum, Wehlander. No: None. Motion carried.)

Approve May 1, 2001 minutes and financial report. (Wyum/Smith, unanimous)

Approve twelve-month dance permit to Geneseo Bar. (Anderson/Wyum, unanimous)

Approve Special Permit to Stir'Um Up Bar & Grill, Stirum for a wedding dance on June 30, 2001. (Brockman/Anderson, unanimous)

Approve site authorization to conduct games of chance at the following locations: Stir'Um Up Bar, Stirum, ND; Geneseo Bar & Cafe, Geneseo, ND; and North Forty Bar, DeLamere, ND. (Smith/Anderson, unanimous)

Chairman Wehlander was notified that Lysle Coleman resigned on the Dickey-Sargent Housing Authority Board. He appointed Commissioner Karen Anderson to fill the position.

Bill Smith reported that on April 26 he met with Duane Hauck, Southeast District Director, NDSU Extension Service to review evaluations with Julie Hassebroek and Connie Gulleson. They discussed the programs offered and how to reach the public and what is the projection for the future. They continue to write grants for additional funding. The Conservation Cropping System Project is looking into leasing land along one of the major highways to allow the farm practice program to expand. Overall it was a good discussion with the department and the different operations they are currently involved in.

Chairman Wehlander left the meeting at 10:00 a.m. to attend a funeral. Vice-Chairman Brockman presided over the meeting.

Sandy Hanson met with the Board to discuss the multi-hazard mitigation plan. Another emergency declaration has been requested by some of the counties in North Dakota and FEMA has asked again for this plan. Sandy has finalized the plan so it can be submitted to FEMA prior to the June 1 deadline. Approve adoption of the Sargent County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. (Wyum/Smith, unanimous) Discussed status of 2001 damage from excessive waters. She has received calls from two individuals and one township. The county has problems with Co. # 1 through Hamlin Grove.

Tracey Anderson, LARC, returned a call to the commission regarding Erickson Mfg. request for local funds on the Eagle Ditcher. She explained the history of the project and the current situation with funding. Local funding is an important part of the project. Sargent County has a JDA and if jobs would be created this would be a place to start.

Connie Gulleson, FNP, informed the Board that the 5 plus 5 program has been completed and Brenda Schreiner was the winner of one day of leave. There were eight participants in the program. The FNP budget proposal is due for approval. The total request is \$10,214.00 with no cost to the county. Approve proposal. (Wyum/Anderson, unanimous)

Sparky Engquist reported on the road department. He discussed the good cooperation this spring from the public on obeying load limits on county roads. He is looking at working on dust control and has contacted some suppliers. The Board approved ordering a tanker load to do an experimental area. The preconstruction conference for the seal coat project is scheduled for June 5 at 10:30 a.m.

LeAnn Even, Mayor, Cogswell City, reported that some lots that the county owns need to be mowed. She said they have hired someone to mow at \$8.00/hour. The

county agreed to pay the mowing and Cogswell City will bill the county monthly. (Wyum/Smith, unanimous)
