The Board in Session, All Members Present.
The minutes of yesterday's session were read and on motion adopted as read.

Mr. Ditzler moved that the following places be designated for the sale of property, sold under chattel mortgage during the ensuing year; to wit:-

at the front door of the Post Office in each of the following places, viz: Stanville, Prompton, Havana Rutland, Cayuga, Genesee, Ransom, DeLamere, Milnor, Swinner, Stirum, Crete, Hample, Nicholson, Harlem and Coxsall; and also at the front door of the Court House in the Town of Forman.

Which motion prevailed, all voting aye.
The following resolution was presented:-

"Resolved, That all weeds known as Canada Thistle, cockle-burr, mustard, wild oats, French Weed and Russian Thistle, shall be destroyed between the first day of June and the fifteenth day of August; said weeds to be mowed and the soil summer-fallowed, or pulled and burned as often as will prevent them from bearing seed. It is further resolved that the Auditor be instructed to call attention of the Overseers of Highways to the act of the last Legislature in regard to the destruction of weeds on all graded or cultivated Highways." Mr. Straub moved the adoption of the foregoing resolution, which motion prevailed. All voting "aye".

The following resolution was presented:-

Be it resolved, That the County of Saragat offer a bounty on gophers, until some further action by the Board of County Commissioners as follows:- For each pocket gopher killed in said county, a bounty of five cents. For each other gopher killed in said county, a bounty of two cents. Said bounties to be paid from the "gopher destruction fund" upon the warrant of the County Auditor, provided that the County Auditor shall issue such warrants only upon the certificate of one
