Norm Preble reported on inundated lands and payments made for pastureland. He made some recommendations for next year's process.

Sparky Engquist informed the Board that ND Job Service has presented an opportunity to get a mechanic at the shop for the summer. Job Service will pay the salary and benefits and the county will provide supervision. The Board accepted the offer from Job Service.

The Board discussed their correspondence with Paul Mathews and instructed the Sargent County States Attorney to request an Attorney General's opinion for the Mathews Family concern regarding the right-of-way deed in the SW1/4-23-130-57 (Wehlander/Anderson, unanimous)

Lyle Bopp met with the Board to discuss a letter he received from Attorney Earl W. Anderson, Jr. representing Deputy Rick Carney. Motion to rescind Rick Carney's two-day suspension and reinstate his pay for May 2 and 3. Instruct the Sheriff to, if he feels warranted to, re-suspend based on appropriate policy and notice of right of appeal. (Wehlander/Anderson, unanimous)

Sandy Hanson met to discuss a letter she received regarding ND Boys State June 11-14 and is requesting Sandy's attendance as a facilitator for the last three days. Authorize attendance at no cost to the county. (Wehlander/Smith, unanimous) A quarterly 911 meeting is scheduled the first week of June in Dickinson and she plans to attend. She discussed the new law that requires dispatch centers to dispatch the nearest service to the call. A map was provided showing the county ambulance areas. The State Radio system upgrade was briefly discussed and she is hopeful that more information will be available at the Dickinson meeting.

An application for abatement and settlement of taxes was received from James Vetter, Milnor. Mr. Vetter is asking that the current special assessments be delayed because he was not able to receive a warranty deed for his property until March 2002. The City of Milnor agreed that the special assessments for 1999 and 2000 be removed and added to the taxes in the years 2014 and 2015. Concur with Milnor City. (Smith/Anderson, unanimous)

Julie Hassebroek introduced Rachel Breker, Rutland who has finished her degree in Family Consumer Sciences at NDSU and is doing an internship in the Extension Agent office this summer. The FNP grant has expired and a new one will not go into effect until October. This grant is in concert with Social Services and the Health District. Information has been provided to the Extension Office for the grant application by the Auditor's Office. The Beef Quality Assurance coordinator from the state has requested Julie's attendance at a conference June 14-15 in Kansas City, MO. All travel expenses will be paid for Julie.

Approve the addendum to the Joint Powers Agreement for Purchasing to include the Federal HIPPA compliance coordination. (Smith/Wehlander, unanimous)

Approve May 7, 2002 minutes as presented. (Smith/Anderson, unanimous)

Jay Mar, Lake Agassiz Regional Council and Larry Lindbergh, NRCS met with the Board to discuss the tree planting project in cooperation with the shore stabilization project at Silver Lake. He explained the plan for short, deeprooted, water tolerant vegetation. They are recommending willow joint plantings in the riprapped portion of the stabilized lakeshore and a single row tree planting in the upland portion behind the rock shoreline. Some of the Board members will travel to the lake to investigate.
