The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the May payroll be approved for a total of \$37,701.79 upon receipt of Wayne Maloney's Feb. time sheet. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Derwood Ellestad, Road Foreman, submitted a list of county roads that should be gravelled this summer. The Board prepared a map and article for the newspaper informing the public of the upcoming request for a mill levy increase for road maintenance on the Primary Election ballot.

Bill Anderson and Jeff Anderson, Anderson Insurance Agency, met with the Board to review the current insurance policy on county buildings, equipment and liability. Several changes were made by the Board.

The following bill was audited. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the bill be paid. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

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The Board reviewed the Department Budgets for July 1, 1984 through December 31, 1984 and made final appropriations. Budget hearings will be held on July 11.

Burlington Northern Railway informed the Board that they will be repairing the tracks between Crete and Milnor beginning August 13, 1984 and ending September 19.

Lyle Bopp, States Attorney, requested approval on a Notice to the Public regarding bad checks. His office will be prosecuting bad checks under a theft statute, due to a recent Supreme Court ruling. Commissioner Smith moved that the Board approve his request and publish a notice in the newspaper for one week. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board transfer from County Poor Relief as follows: \$12,000.00 to Social Welfare and \$2,578.76 to County Poor. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Dave Saylor, Social Service Director, asked the Board to approve insurance and retirement benefits for permanent part-time employees. The current personnel policy states that coverage is only available to full-time employees. Commissioner Smith moved that the county pay one-half of Anne Stein's benefits beginning June 1. Motion withdrawn. The Board agreed to await the recommendation of the Social Service Board on this matter.

The Board discussed the position of Veteran's Service Officer. The Auditor was instructed to invite Murray Heath to the June 19 meeting for a report on the caseload of that department.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the Board adjourn to June 5, 1984 at 9:00 a.m.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that Ardell Johnson and John Manikowski be reappointed to serve on the Sargent County Social Service Board with terms ending June 30, 1987. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Chairman Anderson received a letter from Allen K. Olson, County Agent, informing the Board of his resignation from that position as of June 30, 1984. The Board accepted his resignation.

Commissioner Smith moved that Mag Anderson serve on the County Canvassing Board for the Primary Election. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Arden Barglof, County Sheriff, met with the Board and discussed portable radios. Commissioner Johnson moved that he be allowed to order two (2) Wilson Portable Radios at \$725.00 each and that the VFW Legion in Forman will reimburse the county for one of those radios. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Dave Saylor met with the Board to review all assistance programs available in Sargent County and a breakdown of monies spent on each program. He also proposed a new fringe benefit plan for permanent part-time employees. Commissioner Smith moved that Sargent County pay one-half of Anne Stein's medical insurance beginning June 1, 1984, as she is now a part-time employee. All other employees working part-time shall be responsible for their medical insurance as well as deferred compensation. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried. The Board agreed to review the situation in September.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners proceeded to organize as a Board of Review and Equalization with H. L. Anderson serving as chairman.

Mitch Marcuson, Tax Director, presented a summary of 1984 projected values on all classifications of property in Sargent County. The county average per acre value as certified by the state tax department is \$308.48 for agricultural land. He informed the Board that the Assessment Abstract will be complete and reviewed on July 10.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board of Review and Equalization recess until July 10, 1984 at 1:30 p.m.

Ron Narum, Mayor, Rutland City, discussed a culvert on the County Road on the southwest corner of Rutland. It is plugged and is blocking the drainage ditch. The Board referred him to the Water Board. He also informed the Board that the City of Rutland is seal coating four blocks of the county road comprising Main Street. He quoted an estimate of \$8,325.00. The Board made no commitment on this project.

Wayne Maloney met with the Board on receiving his vacation and sick leave pay while he was drawing Workmen's Comp pay. Commissioner Johnson moved that he be paid for 13 days of vacation and 6.5 days of sick leave. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board agreed to open the east and north doors of the courthouse on Saturday and Sunday during the Forman Centennial.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board present a letter to the States Attorney for his consideration. Said letter is from the Milnor Ambulance Squad regarding Audrey Schultz. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board approve the June payroll in the sum of \$37,350.86. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Members of the Sargent County Water Board met with the Commissioners to discuss several projects involving culverts and bridge repair. The Water Board will cost share all culverts used at 60/40 and pay for removal and installation of culverts on County No. 3. The county will provide the gravel and transport the culverts to the locations.

Murray Heath, Veteran's Service Officer, presented the monthly report to the Board and answered questions pertaining to his department. The Board asked to meet with him at least once each year to continue good communications.

The Sargent County Fair Board met with the Commissioners to discuss their requests on November 22, 1983. Roger Zetocha agreed to get some estimates for reshingling the auditorium. Commissioner Smith will get the cement work done under the grandstand. The unauthorized use of the auditorium was discussed and a letter will be sent requesting all keys be turned in to the Auditor's Office at once. Commissioner H. L. Anderson will spray the weeds around the buildings. Approval was granted to the Fair Board to proceed with plans for a beer garden during the fair.

Don Bailey, McLaughlin and Schulz, presented a price estimate for resealing 25 miles of county road. The price per mile was \$7,534.45. No decision was made.

Tim Ellestad and Bob Thayer met with the Board. Tim requested sick leave pay during the time he was laid up in August, 1983. The Board denied this but agreed to pay him for 2 days of vacation. Bob Thayer reported that his road grader is leaking hydraulic oil. The Board will make arrangements to send it to Butler Machinery in Fargo.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the Request by the Department of Human Services for Satisfaction of Trust Mortgage for Annie Anderson. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the Election Cost Bills in the sum of \$3,505.57. Warrant Nos. 1165-1248. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

The results of the 1984 Primary Election are as follows: Certificates of Nominations were presented to: Elaine A. marquette, M. Ardell Johnson, H. L. Anderson and William P. Bosse. The County Road Levy canvass was Yes 544-No 346.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board approve Cogswell and Forman Fire Dept. to go on the County Frequency. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the Board transfer \$5,103.16 from County Poor Relief to County Poor. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Earl Weber, Erma Bishoff and Renee Anderson met with the Board to discuss sick leave, holidays and vacation for permanent part-time employees. The Board informed them that they will be reviewing the policies in September prior to approving the twelve month budget.

Renee Anderson discussed mosquito traps. The state has provided two for Sargent County and they will be removing them and requested Sargent County to purchase two at \$146.50 each. The commissioners suggested that the Health Board use monies allocated to them from State Aid to make the purchases.

Don Marquette met with the Board to protest the spraying of brush along Buffalo Lake. The spray is killing the chokecherry bushes and he feels it is not necessary to spray that area. Commissioner H. L. Anderson will talk to the Weed Board.

The Board set a priority list of roads to be graveled in the county and will make arrangements to start the work this week.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner Johnson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board issue a new rental contract to Southeast Senior Services at the existing rates effective until September 29, 1985. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The Lake Agassiz Regional Council strives to assist in the planning and economic development of Sargent County and the Lake Agassiz Regional as a whole; and

WHEREAS, planning and economic development are the objectives of the Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County,

BE IT RESOLVED, that Sargent County approves and supports the planning and economic development program and budget of the Lake Agassiz Regional Council during July 1, 1984 thru December 31, 1984 in the amount of \$400.00.

Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the resolution and the resolution was duly declared carried and adopted.

Sheriff Barglof met with the Board and presented resolutions relative to stray or vicious animals in Sargent County. The Board reviewed the resolutions and will request an opinion from the States Attorney before taking any action.

New premium rates from Blue Cross and Blue Shield were reviewed by the Board. The increase on the county group was 36%. The Board agreed to do some checking into other insurance policies.

Commissioner Manikowski arrived at 2:00 p.m.

The Board reconvened as a Board of Review and Equalization. Mitch Marcuson, Director of Tax Equalization presented all the abstracts with True and Full Value as well as Taxable Value for each township and city in the county. He indicated that there is very little change in valuations and also that the state changes should not increase the total county valuations.

The following bill was presented for payment. Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board approve payment. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.



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

WHEREAS, it would become unduly burdensome for the County to provide transportation or impoundment of all such animals;

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Sargent County Board of Commissioners hereby notifies the public that Sargent County will not be responsible for impounding any stray or vicious animals. Further, the Sargent County Sheriff is not to assume any responsibility for impounding any such animals. Any animal suspected of being rabid will not become the responsibility of Sargent County or the Sargent County Sheriff and should be the responsibility of the person coming in contact with the suspected animal. The Sheriff will assist in providing transportation to the State Health Department when an emergency situation arises and when the Sheriff's Department is available to provide transportation. This resolution shall in no case absolve or attempt to absolve Sargent County or its Sheriff's Department of any legal responsibilities nor to limit the Sheriff's Department from impounding, transporting or destroying suspected rabid animals, when at the Sheriff's discretion, such action is warranted.

Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the resolution and on roll call vote all commissioners voted aye and the resolution was duly declared carried and adopted.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board re-appoint Bruce Speich, DeLamere, ND and David Kosmatka, Forman, ND to the Sargent County Weed Board for a term of four years. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

The County Auditor requested permission to dispose of Personal Property Replacement records from 1946-1969. The Board asked that these records be retained.
