



THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET AT THEIR OFFICE IN THE COURTHOUSE, PURSUANT TO ADJOURNMENT, WITH ALL MEMBERS PRESENT.

THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING WERE READ AND ON MOTION APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS READ.

THE BOARD PROCEEDED TO AUDIT PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD BILLS.

COMMISSIONER LOUDEN INTRODUCED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION AND MOVED ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, SECTION 7 OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BEER RESOLUTION PROVIDES: "IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION TO ENGAGE IN THE SALE OF BEER AS DEFINED WITHIN THE COUNTY OF SARGENT AND STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, EXCEPT IN INCORPORATED VILLAGES AND CITIES, WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A LICENSE SO TO DO AS PROVIDED HEREIN AND NO LICENSE SHALL BE GRANTED TO ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION TO SELL BEER EXCEPT IN UNINCORPORATED TOWNS OR VILLAGES NOW IN EXISTENCE, THE PLATS OF WHICH ARE NOW OF RECORD" AND

WHEREAS, AS SECTION 8 OF THE INITIATED BEER ACT AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 97 OF THE LAWS OF 1935 AND WHICH AMENDED ACT PROVIDES: "IT IS HEREBY CONFERRED UPON THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF EACH COUNTY THE SAME POWERS AND AUTHORITY AS ARE HEREIN GRANTED TO THE GOVERNING BOARDS OF INCORPORATED CITIES AND VILLAGES, RELATIVE TO THE RETAILING OF BEER IN ALL TERRITORY OUTSIDE OF INCORPORATED CITIES AND VILLAGES," AND

WHEREAS, THIS AMENDED SECTION THEREFORE MAKES NO REFERENCE TO THE EXERCISE OF REGULATION OR CONTROL IN UNINCORPORATED VILLAGES IN EXISTENCE AT THE TIME THE ACT WAS PASSED, THE LIMITATION CONTAINED IN SECTION 8 OF THE ORIGINAL BEER ACT WHICH IS SECTION 7 OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BEER RESOLUTION IS NO LONGER LAW,

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT SECTION 7 OF THE SARGENT COUNTY BEER RESOLUTION BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS: "IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION TO ENGAGE IN THE SALE OF BEER AS DEFINED WITHIN THE COUNTY OF SARGENT IN THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA EXCEPT IN INCORPORATED CITIES AND VILLAGES AND IT IS HEREBY CONFERRED UPON THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS THE SAME POWER AND AUTHORITY AS GRANTED TO THE GOVERNING BOARDS OF INCORPORATED CITIES AND VILLAGES, RELATIVE TO THE RETAILING OF BEER OUTSIDE INCORPORATED CITIES AND VILLAGES."
