WHEREAS, all elective positions are subject to change following any General Election,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the salary of any newly elected official in Sargent County shall be the base salary as set by the State of North Dakota for that position, and that said resolution go into effect with the next General Election.

Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the resolution and on roll call vote, all voted aye, no one voted nay and the resolution was duly declared carried and adopted.

Commissioner Smith made a motion that an air conditioner be purchased from Martinsen's to be installed in the vault which serves as the computer room. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Jeff Volk, Moore Engineering, discussed several bridges that are on the Bridge Replacement Priority list with the State Highway Department. The Board agreed to have Mr. Volk attend a meeting in Valley City on August 3, 1983, in which the state will be seeking input for upcoming bridge replacement projects as well as Federal Aid Road projects. He will put together estimates on the bridges as selected by the Board.

Don Bailey, McLaughlin & Schulz, discussed chipping and sealing roads in Sargent County. The Board selected 32.5 miles of county roads to be chipped and sealed. Mr. Bailey quoted \$6,949.36/mile and Bernard Mahrer Construction will do the hauling of the chips. Commissioner Manikowski moved that Sargent County let a contract with McLaughlin and Schulz for 32.5 miles and that work begin as soon as possible. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded

the motion and same carried unanimously.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that Maurice Orn be reappointed to the Sargent County Weed Board and Wallace Kleven be appointed to replace Joe Breker, who did not wish to be reappointed Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried. The terms will expire August 10, 1987.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that Permit No. 83-28 be issued to the Sargent County Fair Board for Bingo to be held on Sept. 2 - Sept. 5, 1983 at the Sargent County Fairgrounds. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve a Dance Permit to Crete Bar for a period of twelve months. Said premises located on Lots 2 & 3, Block 2, Crete, ND. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

R. S. R. Cooperative is requesting a permit to install underground electric power cable on County Road No. 14 between Sections 13 and 14, Township 130N and Range 53W. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the permit be issued with the stipulation that the cable be pushed or tunneled under the road surface. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Judge Tjon met with the Board and discussed the salary for the magistrate. He felt if the Board would not approve a \$100/year salary for this position that he would strip the magistrate of her duties. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the \$100/year for magistrate salary. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and on roll call vote, Commissioners Manikowski, Mag Anderson, H. L. Anderson and Johnson voted age, Commissioner Smith chose to abstain. Motion carried.

The Board discussed current rates being charged by the Forman and Milnor Ambulance Services. There is a problem in billing when a backup service is needed when one of the ambulances is in service. The Board agreed to adopt a uniform charge for both ambulances. Commissioner Smith moved that the ambulance service charge \$40.00 Base and \$2.00 per loaded mile. The \$2.00 charge will apply to loaded mile only. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Due to a conflict on August 16, the next meeting of the Board of County Commissioners will be August 23, 1983 at 9:00 a.m. A notice will be published to that affect.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Smith moved that the minutes be approved as corrected. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the August payroll in the sum of \$38,628.47 be approved. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board appoint John Manikowski as their representative on the North Dakota State Fair Association. Commissioner H.L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board approved the transfer of \$600.00 from County General to County Health. This amount will be paid out to the District Board of Health for the first quarter expenditures exclusive of payroll.

The Board proceeded to open bids for one new diesel truck, one extra heavy-duty hopper-type self-unloading /spreader body and one new motor grader. Bids were received as follows:

One New Diesel Truck: Wolfe Ford, Lidgerwood, ND - 1984-F-7000-\$25,371.09; Wolfe Ford, Lidgerwood, ND - 1984-F-700 D - \$22,499.37; and Red River International, Inc., Fargo, ND - \$21,700.00.

One Extra Heavy-Duty Hopper-Type Self-Unloading/Spreader Body: Northwestern Equipment, Inc., Fargo, ND - \$10,250.00.

One New Motor Grader: Northwestern Equipment, Inc., Fargo, ND - Galion 500-E with Falls Plow & Wing - Rigid - \$77,700.00, Articulated - \$82,000.00; General Diesel & Equipment Co., Inc., Fargo, ND - Champion 715 - Rigid - \$75,650.00, Articulated-\$80,150.00; Champion 740 - Rigid-\$94,190.00, Articulated-\$98,690.00; Butler Machinery Co., Fargo, ND - Caterpillar 140G - with Balderson Plow and Wing - Articulated-\$99,125.00, With Falls Plow & Sing-Articulated-\$94,987.00; Midwest Industrial Equipment Co., Inc., Fargo, ND - John Deere 770-A with Henke Plow & Wing-Articulated-\$95,428.00

Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Larry Even, Milton McLaen and Norbert Kulzer discussed the Buffalo Lake project with the commissioners. The Board assured them that the county would have equipment and man power the latter part September to finish the work on the Buffalo Lake road.

Royce C. Braley, Mid America Agency asked the Board's permission to talk with county employees about coverage for cancer, heart disease and stroke, accidents and intensive care. The Board granted Mr. Braley permission.

Commissioner H.L. Anderson moved that the Board approve the purchase of five typewriters from Steffens Office Equipment. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board issue a permit to sell alcoholic beverages at a special event to Don Kadoun for October 28, 1983 at the Stirum Hall. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board agreed to publish a notice to accept bids for the building located on the northwest corner of Block 14, Forman City. Bids will be opened on September 20, 1983.

Ray Wiese met with the Board to discuss a graveling project. The Board approved gravel on one mile of County #5 and spot gravel as per the road foreman's request up to Brampton.

Jeff Volk, Moore Engineering, met with the Board and discussed the two bridges that are being considered for state matching. They are looking at a November bid opening with work to begin in the spring of 1984.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the Board adjourn to September 6, 1983 at 9:00 a.m.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Smith moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board proceeded to decide on the purchase of a motor grader as per bids let on August 23, 1983. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board accept the bid of Butler Machinery Co. for a 140C Caterpillar with Falls Snow Plow and Wing under a five year lease purchase plan. They would also provide a three year or 5,000 hour power train warranty, and 48 hour parts and service availability guarantee. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion. On roll call vote, those voting aye: Commissioners Manikowski, Mag Anderson, H.L. Anderson and Johnson. Voting nay: Commissioner Smith. Motion carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the following Games of Chance be approved: Permit No. 83-29 to DeLamere Community Hall Ass'n, DeLamere, ND for a raffle and bingo on November 5, 1983 at the DeLamere Community Hall; Permit No. 83-30 to St. Peter and Paul Church, Cayuga, ND for a raffle and bingo on October 30, 1983 at the St. Peter and Paul Church. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Derwood Ellestad, road foreman, met with the Board to discuss several projects that are pending. The Board instructed him to contact Bernard Mahrer Construction to assist in fixing up the road south of Cayuga and that a separate account should be maintained on all expenses. Negotiations are still pending with Senator Mark Andrews regarding this project.

The Board also instructed Mr. Ellestad to install signs south of Cayuga informing travelers of the rough road and that he should go ahead and complete the repairs to the road south of Geneseo.

The Board discussed the road four miles north of Stirum. The North Dakota State Highway Department has not contacted this Board regarding the road, therefore, the Board instructed the road foreman to patch the road as necessary and keep records as per man hours and materials. Negotiations with the State Highway Department will be made before any funds are remitted.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the second regular meeting of this Board for November be held on November 22, 1983 due to a conflict with the North Dakota County Commissioner's Convention. Commissioner H.L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board instructed the Auditor to call for bids on a 1975 Model 6057N Champion Motor Grader which the county has for sale. Bids will be opened at 10:00 o'clock a.m. on October 4, 1983.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Sargent County Board of Commissioners approve a Personnel Policy for Sargent County effective immediately. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried. Copies of said policy are on file in the Office of the County Auditor.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner H.L. Anderson moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Dave Potter, Refuge Manager, Tewaukon Wildlife Refuge, met with the Board for the purpose of discussing the county road south of Cayuga. Mr. Potter explained that in 1968 the Fish and Wildlife Service paid for the paving project at a total of \$36,000.00. The commissioners noted that in order to get any federal assistance on future repairs, they have to work through the refuge. Mr. Potter said that if any money would be allocated for a road project, that Fish and Wildlife should not finance this project - if the refuge causes damage to the roads, they are willing to pay for repairs. The Board of Commissioners shall record this as their initial meeting with refuge personnel and other contacts will be made for federal assistance.

No bids were received for the 1975 Champion Motor Grader, therefore the bid opening was cancelled.

Henry Wisness, Secondary Roads and Charles Kahl, District Office, North Dakota State Highway Department discussed the status of the Stirum road that was constructed in August, 1982. Mr. Kahl reported that the inhouse report overall was very good. There was 6.2% asphalt, 24% rock and that all materials were good. He felt that the breakup was due to heavy loading on a sensitive subgrade, which was very hard, but due to moisture and thawing, it caused considerable breakup. He indicated that the heavy loading was coming from the north. The Board expressed assistance from the State Highway Department in negotiating a favorable outcome on this project.

The Board read a letter from the Office of the North Dakota State Tax Commissioner informing them that Sargent County will see a 7% increase in Agricultural Property as scheduled by the State Board of Equalization. Said increase will be in effect for 1983 taxes.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board send a letter to our North Dakota Congressional Delegation, Governor Olson and the Public Service Commission seeking their support in opposing the railroad abandonment that is being discussed in the northern part of Sargent County, namely through the towns of Milnor, Gwinner and Stirum. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried. Copies of said letter will be sent to the managers of the elevators in the affected towns.


Grover Riebe, Randy Rotenberger and Tommy Hartness, members of the Gwinner Airport Authority, discussed the possibility of forming a county airport authority in Sargent County. They have done some crack sealing on their airport runway last year and received some assistance from the state. The runway will need a complete overlay soon and there is no funding available for such a project. The Board of Commissioners felt that the straw vote of 9 to 1 has set precedence over any decisions at this time. They suggested that the Gwinner Airport Authority do some ground work and contact residents to explain what their project would involve. They will keep in touch with the Board of Commissioners.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the bills be approved for payment. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.



The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the minutes as distributed. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board approve the December payroll in the sum of \$37,766.02. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

The Board reviewed a new contract from Richland County for prisoner's board. The present rate is \$17.50 per day and they will increase it to \$21.00 per day. Commissioner Smith moved that Sargent County sign the contract with Richland County. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the second quarter allocation to the Sargent County Health District be approved in the amount of \$600.00. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Allen Olson, County Agent, presented the Sargent County Extension Year Highlight Report for 1982-83. He also discussed a micro-computer that NDSU is proposing to all counties in the state.

Jeff Volk, Moore Engineering, reviewed the final plans on CBRS-4135 (51) and CBRS-4129 (51). The bid letting will be held in Bismarck on February 3, 1984. He also discussed three other bridges that he will do some research on and submit to the Board at a later date for their consideration. Those bridges are: 117-23, 123-20 and 130-17.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board change the January meeting dates to January 10, and 24, 1984. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the following transfers of funds be made to cover deficits in each fund: \$8,600.00 from County Road, \$8,000.00 from County I & S and \$3,300.00 from Federal Revenue Sharing to County Special Highway; \$1,600.00 from County Poor Relief to County Poor; \$3,500.00 from County General to Social Security. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:


WHEREAS, tax collections for the County Agent fund and Social Welfare fund are insufficient to meet December expenditures, and

WHEREAS, other funds are considerably low and cannot replenish said funds,


