The Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioner H. L. Anderson absent.

The purpose of the meeting was to conduct a hearing of competitors on the application of Crete Grain Company, Inc., for exemption from ad valorem taxation of the property which the applicant will use in the operation of a grain elevator at Crete, ND.

Several competitors and other interested persons were present at the hearing and voiced their opinion on said application. The majority of those present were opposed to the tax exemption because they felt that it was not a new business, unfair to the competition and it would hurt the roads and the revenue would be less.

The Board of County Commissioners discussed the application and Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board deny said application. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board adjourn to August 3, 1982 at 9:00 a.m.

The Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board reviewed a letter from Rep. J. D. Crabtree in regards to a bill for an Act to amend and reenact sections 61-16.1-10 and 61-16.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code. Mr. Crabtree was seeking input from the county commissioners. The Board was informed from the Water Resource Board that they voted unanimously to support passage of this bill. The county commissioners decided to inform Mr. Crabtree that they too will support this bill.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners request to go on record that any county or township road or city streets be restored to the same condition as they were prior to construction of MANDAN power line, and also that a representative of the township and county and a representative of MANDAN and the construction crew go as a delegation to inspect the roads and streets before and after construction. The above statement was made on behalf of the county commissioners at a public hearing held in Forman on July 22, 1982 in regards to MANDAN.

Commissioner Johnson made a motion that any money received from ambulance runs and any money on hand or in investments after January, 1983 be placed in a special fund for the purpose of replacement vehicles. This special fund shall be taken care of by each ambulance squad. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

The county commissioners moved that effective August 3, 1982 the Sargent County Water Resource Board shall have 5 members rather than the three that are presently serving the Board. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board appoint the following persons to serve on the Water Resource Board. John C. Totenhagen-District 5-term ending February, 1985 and Danny Jacobson-District 3-term ending February, 1986. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried. Other members of the Water Resource Board are: Mike Paczkowski-District 1; Waynard W. Lien-District 2; and James Bosse-District 4.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board reappoint Dennis Dockter to the Sargent County Weed Board, term ending August 10, 1986. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Curt Freitag, Civil Defense Director met with the Board and presented the Natural Disaster Emergency Operations Plan.

Commissioner Manikowski introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

By virtue of the authority vested in the Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County by the North Dakota Disaster Act of 1973, NDCC 37-17.1, we do approve and issue the Sargent County Natural Disaster Emergency Operations Plan. Upon approval, this plan shall have the full force and effect of law.

Commissioner Johnson seconded the resolution and said resolution was declared carried and adopted.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the laying of pavement from County Road 3 and south 4 miles to County Road 5. Said pavement being laid on County Road 10. Bernard Mahrer Consturction, Inc. will be doing the work for a sum of \$216,600.00. Plans are to begin work the second week in August. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously on roll call vote.

The Board proceeded to hold a final hearing on the 1982-1983 budget.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board amend the proposed budget for Farm to Market Road. Previously submitted was \$210,000.00 and an additional \$165,000.00 will be added for a total of \$375,000.00. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

No taxpayer appeared in opposition of the budget for 1982-1983. Commissioner Orth moved that the budget be approved as amended. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner Johnson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

The Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Johnson moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the August payroll in the amount of \$34,027.78 be approved. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, during the fiscal year 1982-1983, Sargent County will experience a deficit in the County Poor and Social Welfare funds caused by excessive expenditures,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sargent County Board of Commissioners hereby appropriate \$65,681.00 to be levied for County Poor Relief for the 1982 tax year.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the resolution and on roll call vote, all commissioners voted aye and no one voted nay and the resolution was duly declared carried and adopted.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board approve Games of Chance Permit No. 16 for Sargent County Farm Bureau for a raffle to be held at the Havana Community Hall on October 2, 1982. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that a notice be published informing landowners along county and township roads that all weeds and grasses shall be mowed and obstructions removed no later than October 1 or the work will be ordered done and costs charged against land taxes. Fee for cutting weeds and grasses shall be \$50.00 per one-half mile.

Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board instructed the Auditor to send a letter to the Forman Lions in regards to the freezers located under the Sargent County Grandstand.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board grant permission to the R. S. R. Electric Cooperative, Inc. to install underground electric power cable on county road right-of-way at the following locations and under conditions on file in the auditor's office: NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 12-129N-58W and NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 11-129N-58W in Southwest Township. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

The Sargent County Courthouse is placed on the National Register for Historic Places and therefore is eligible for matching grants to restore and preserve the building. Commissioner Orth moved that Betty Johnson be appointed to write a grant for insulation and restoration of the dome and also masonry and improvements on the chimney. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and motion carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that a transfer be made to County Special Highway for August payroll and August road expenses. The amounts transferred shall be as follows: \$20,000.00 from County Road and \$50,000.00 from Federal Revenue Sharing. Commissioner H. L. Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

North Dakota State Highway representatives were present and gave a audio awareness on the preservation of county, state and township roads. They encourage all North Dakotans to contact their legislators to support any transportation bills at the next legislature.


Don Kaul, President, R. E. Huffman, discussed a new taxation program with the Board. Their decision was tabled until such program has been demonstrated.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioner Manikowski absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Johnson moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

The North Dakota State Highway Department informed Sargent County that they will be inspecting 41 bridges located in the county in September and October for a cost of \$350,100.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board approve Games of Chance Permit No. 17 to DeLamere Community Hall Association for a raffle and bingo to be held on November 13, 1982 at the DeLamere Hall. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Glenn Koppin, Directory Service, met with the Board and discussed the 1983 Ransom-Sargent Directory. The Board agreed to purchase 20 books and a page for the county personnel names and telephone numbers at a cost of \$292.00. Mr. Koppin will meet with the Auditor in November to finalize information for the book, which will be available in December, 1982.

The Board proceeded to open bids for propane. Only one bid was received from the Farmers Union Oil Co., Forman, ND. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that the Board accept the bid from Farmers Union Oil for 5¢ off retail price at time of delivery. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Syd, Hanson, County Health Nurse, distributed the July and August narrative and also a fact sheet and brochure promoting the passage of the question to be on the General Election ballot regarding forming a health district. The Board informed Mrs. Hanson that if the question is defeated at the General Election, there is a chance that they will not fund the program for 1983-1984. They also noted that the straw vote that was taken a few years ago, was only to find out if the public wanted a health program and now the question is whether or not they want a mill levy put on to support the program.

The Board reconvened with Commissioner Manikowski present.

Al Clark, Engineer, Ultieg Engineers, Inc. and a representative from the State Highway Department, accompanied the Board up to the Federal Aid project which has been done north of Stirum. The Board requested that Mr. Clark contact the contractor and suggest to him that a overlay be done on the areas of the road which are rough and cracked. Mr. Clark informed the Board that he would do this and get back with the Auditor on the results.

Curt Freitag, Civil Defense Director, met with the Board and presented the Local Emergency Annual Program Progress Report for 1982-1983. He also submitted information relating to the radio system which will be installed for his department.

WHEREAS, Sargent County has levied one mill upon the net taxable assessed valuation of the property in the county for county agent work and,

WHEREAS, excessive expenditures have caused a deficit, determining that the amount derived from the mill levy is insufficient and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we the duly elected Sargent County Commissioners place before the electors at the November 2, 1982 General Election the following question to-wit: "Shall the County of Sargent, State of North Dakota, levy an additional annual tax levy not to exceed one mill on the net taxable assessed valuation of the property in the county, until discontinued as provided by law, for the purpose of supplementing other resources and funds to carry on county agent work in Sargent County in cooperation with the North Dakota State University, pursuant to the provisions of Section 4-08-15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code."

Commissioner Orth seconded the resolution and on roll call vote, all commissioners voted aye and the re-

solution was duly declared carried and adopted.

Commissioner Orth moved that the Board adjourn to September 14, 1982, at 9:00 a.m.

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioner H. L. Anderson absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the minutes be approved as read. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Orth moved that the Board approve the September payroll in the sum of \$35,540.36. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

A Contract for Boarding Juveniles from the Cass County Sheriff's Dept. was discussed. Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board sign the contract in the event that Sargent County might need to use the juvenile facilities in Cass County. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried. A copy of the contract is on file in the Auditor's Office.

Commissioner Orth moved that the request for a Bonding Contract from the Southeast Senior Services, which included Richland and Sargent County Senior Services, be approved. Said contract would be for bonding for 2 positions at \$20,000.00 each and would be no cost to Sargent County for said bonding. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board instructed the Chairman and Auditor to sign authorization for the North Dakota State Highway Dept. for standards for county and township roads. The roads in Sargent County are the same design as reported in 1976.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that Sargent County shall charge \$25.00 for a special permit to authorize the sale of alcoholic beverages at special events in the county, pursuant to Section 5-02-0121 of the NDCCC. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board transfer \$20,000.00 from Federal Revenue Sharing to County Special Highway. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Orth moved that the Board transfer \$4,000.00 from County General to the County Agent Fund. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that Sargent County will cost share a culvert with the Water Resource Board at a 40/60 percent. Said culvert will be placed in Southwest Township on Drain #11. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Tom Domak, Pitney Bowes, demonstrated a postage machine and digital scale to the Board. The Board agreed to purchase the scale and delivery can be expected in December, 1982.

Allen Olson, County Agent, met with the Board and discussed the upcoming election regarding the one mill increase for county agent work.

Curt Freitag, Civil Defense Director, discussed the upcoming DES exercise which he has scheduled in Sargent County.

Assistant States Attorney Donald Wieber met with the Board on an employee problem. The Board agreed to hold an informal hearing on September 28, 1982 at 10:00 a.m. at which time they will consider whether his employment with the county should terminate.

Commissioner Orth moved that the Board adjourn to September 28, 1982.

The special meeting of the Sargent County Board of Commissioners was opened with all commissioners present. Also present were: Assistant States Attorney Donald Wieber, Wayne and Pam Maloney.

Chairman Anderson noted that the purpose of the meeting was to determine whether or not Wayne's employment with Sargent County should be terminated due to his conduct toward members of the commission.

Wayne proceeded to give a recap on what had transpired since his employment with Sargent County in February 1982. He felt that the commissioners had been giving him the run around and that he was never given a straight answer on why he did not receive a raise in July.

The commission explained to Wayne that when the budget was approved a freeze was put on all salaries. Commissioner Orth noted that he had explained this to Wayne on September 7 that he would not be getting a salary increase.

Upon further discussion, it was decided to call in Derwood Ellestad. Mr. Ellestad explained that he thought it was county policy that after 6 months, all road employees would get the same salary. The commission said that employees are eligible for a raise but that is not mandatory that they receive the raise at the end of six

months.

The Board asked Wayne if he was satisfied with his job, and he replied that he was, but did not enjoy getting the run around. They also asked him if he would work for \$1050.00/month and he said he would, but would need more money if they expected him to do different work.

Commissioner Manikowski explained that it was suggested that he sign a complaint against Wayne and his actions in Geneseo on September 14. The Board agreed that a hearing would be more beneficial to both parties. Commissioner Orth mentioned that this Board is responsible for supervising the conduct of all county employees and that harrasment and threats wereuncalled for by any employee.

Assistant States Attorney Wieber suggest^{ed} that the Board discuss the situation and make a decision. There are various options to consider: terminate job, probation or leave as is.

Mr. Ellestad stated that he needs a man on the road and would have to hire a new guy right away if Wayne's position was vacated. 

Commissioner Manikowski moved that Sargent County authorize purchase of a LANIER advocate II System to be used specifically for the new court system effective January 1, 1983. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion and same carried unanimously. Ransom/Sargent County Judge shall use the system and total cost to be divided 50/50 shall be \$5,547.00

Commissioner Johnson moved that John Manikowski be appointed to serve on the Sargent County Social Service Board to fulfill the term of Walter Orth effective January 1, 1983. Said term shall expire June 30, 1984. Commissioner H. L. Anderson moved that a unanimous ballot be cast for Manikowski's appointment.

Upon motion the Board agreed that Blue Cross/Blue Shield premiums shall be paid effective January 1, 1983 for all newly elected if each official so chooses to enroll in the insurance plan.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve Games of Chance Permit No. 21 to DeLamere Community Hall Association for Bingo on December 17, 1982 and April 2, 1983. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board instructed the Auditor to inform Lake Agassiz Regional Council that H. J. Anderson will succeed Walter Orth on their Board of Directors as the Sargent County representative.

Allen Olson discussed the telelecture findings and what the phone company had to offer. No decision was made. He also presented the 1981-82 Highlight Report.

A delegation involved in the improvement of Buffalo Lake met with the Board to inform them on what has been done this fall. Larry even, spokesperson for the group said that over \$900 has been donated for improvements. He noted that the work is only partially done and that someone with authority would be needed to complete the project. The road needs to be regraded, trees cleared and also some signs should be posted. The Board agreed that they would offer assistance in the form of machinery and manpower next spring. The Board also suggested that a special account be set up at a bank and all bills should be paid out of this account.

A call was received on the housing of the Sargent County Abstract Company. The Board agreed that the office shall remain upstairs and that a monthly rental fee of \$150 shall be changed effective January 1, 1983.

The Board moved to go on record that a declaration be sent to Governor Allen Olson declaring Sargent County a disaster area due to severe drought and resultant loss of crops.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner Orth moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

The county will be notified prior to actual hauling. These terms will be on the plan of the project.

County Judge-elect Tjon reported his decision to hire Darci Asche of Gwinner as his clerk reporter at a starting salary of \$725.00 a month. The salary and insurance will be paid jointly by Ransom and Sargent counties. Mr. Tjon has scheduled Monday forenoons, all day Wednesdays and Fridays for Sargent County judge duties. A county magistrate will be appointed for Sargent County at the next meeting.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that Duane Halmrast would be laid off as of December 31, 1982, due to the lack of work as mechanic at the county shop. Commissioner Orth seconded the motion, and motion carried.

Commissioner Orth was presented a plaque from the commissioners as appreciation for the 14 years he had served the county as a commissioner.

Commissioner Orth moved that the Board adjourn to January 4, 1983, at 9:00 a.m.
