The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioner Smith absent.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the September payroll in the sum of \$36,325.17 be approved for payment. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

The Board moved to send a letter to the three schools in Sargent County requesting their consideration to close the schools on the Friday preceding Labor Day. This would enable the exhibitors more time to bring their exhibits to the Sargent County Fair. The Board also discussed the possibility of eliminating any sport activities on that evening.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the Remote Software System available through Dakota Programs. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Curtis Freitag, Sargent County DES Director, reviewed the Local Emergency Management Organization Co-Operative Agreement Work Plan for Sargent County for FY 1985. The Board discussed the plan and moved to approve said work plan.

Curtis Freitag also discussed some problems with wiring at the fairgrounds. The Board moved to approve his request to do the rewiring on the fairground premises to improve the existing hazardous wiring.

Patty Carlen, Register of Deeds & Clerk of Court, met with the Board to inform them that her Deputy, Edith Malpert, has submitted her resignation effective November 1, 1984. Patty asked the Board to approve her appointment of Joan Lee, Cayuga, as the new deputy. The Board approved said request and agreed to pay her \$600 per month during training and start at \$950 per month as deputy and reconsider her wage after the six month probationary period.

An application for a Dance hall Permit was received from Mary Ann Opitz. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve the permit for Lots 21-22-23, Block 8, Village of Veda, for twelve months. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

The following bills were audited. Commissioner Manikowski moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

The Board proceeded to discuss health coverage for county employees. Commissioner Smith moved that the Board change from the present plan "Comprehensive Plan A" with Blue Cross to a Blue Cross/Blue Shield Comprehensive Major Medical Plan C effective January 1, 1985. The county will self-insure the difference between Plan A and Plan C on the deductible and co-insurance. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Gina Hillestad, County Treasurer, met with the Board to inform them of the resignation of Sue Kleingarn, Deputy Treasurer, effective October 8, 1984. Gina asked the Board to approve the appointment of Darlene Colbert, Forman, as Deputy Treasurer. Commissioner Smith moved that said appointment be approved and that her salary be set at \$950.00 and she be placed on a 6 month probationary period. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board approve the following budget for the twelve-month period beginning January 1, 1985 and ending December 31, 1985 and that the Budget Hearing be scheduled for Tuesday, October 9, 1984 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioner's Room. 

The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with Commissioner H. L. Anderson absent.

Commissioner Smith moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Smith moved that the Board approve the October payroll in the sum of \$37,767.50. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Supt. Leon Johnson, Sargent Central School District and Supt. Dale Fuhrman, Milnor School District, met with the Board regarding a letter they received from the commissioners concerning closing school on the Friday prior to Labor Day. It is the policy of both schools to excuse any student who needs that day to prepare for the Sargent County Fair. The Board agreed to speak to the County Agent and request that he relay this information to the 4-H leaders and students. The Friday night football game was discussed and both schools felt that it would be difficult to reschedule to another night. They assured the commissioners that they would see what they could do for 1985. The superintendents asked if the county road system would be closed to buses in the spring. The commissioners replied that a letter would be sent to all schools in the county stating that it might be necessary to pull the buses during the spring thaw.

Vic McGuire inquired about purchasing glass bookcases from the county. The Board decided that these were not for sale at this time, but possibly an auction may be held in the future.

Lois Case, Sargent County representative on the SENDCA Advisory Council, requested that she be removed from this Board. Each person may only serve for ten years and then must be replaced. The Board thanked Lois for her interest and service on this council. A notice will be published seeking applicants prior to the appointment.

Jeff Volk, Moore Engineering, Inc., met with the Board and discussed the status on the bridges located north of Cayuga and Geneseo. He informed the Board that there is a penalty being assessed for each working day beyond the completion date. It was noted that the county road crew has hauled 20 ton of gravel to the Cayuga site and are maintaining the roadway during construction. Mr. Volk advised the Board to speak to the contractor and set up an agreement between both parties on maintenance of roadway.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board approve Games of Chance Permit No. 84-06 to DeLamere Hall Association for a raffle and bingo on November 17, 1984. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried.





The following bills were audited. Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.



The Sargent County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the minutes be approved as distributed. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

Commissioner Johnson moved that the Board approve the November payroll in the amount of \$39,160.43. Commissioner Mag Anderson seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the Board approve the payment of election bills totalling \$3,349.81. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried unanously. Warrant Nos. 1902-1907, 1909-1929, 1931-1962, 1969-1992.

The Board reviewed the results of the General Election held on November 6, 1984. The following persons were elected: Elaine A. Marquette, County Superintendent of Schools, M. Ardell Johnson, County Commissioner, 2nd District, H. L. Anderson, County Commissioner, 4th District, William P. Bosse, Director, Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, and Duayne Baldwin, Supervisor, Wild Rice Soil Conservation.

Grover Riebe, Donald Hartness and Raymond McFarland joined the commissioners to discuss the Gwinner Airport. The Gwinner Airport Authority has been in contact with the State Aeronautics Commission to obtain information on receiving county funding. Mr. Riebe informed the commissioners that there are two plans. 1) the county could create an airport authority, which would make it necessary for the City of Gwinner to relinquish their ownership of the airport or 2) enact a county-wide mill levy for maintenance purposes to be contracted by the county through the Gwinner Airport Authority. At present time, the air strip is in decent shape, but there are no funds to maintain and operate. The Gwinner Airport Authority agreed to contact local residents to discuss the situation.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the Board consider the enactment of a county-wide mill levy not to exceed One mill to support airport authorities in Sargent County at the January 8, 1985 meeting. Commissioner Johnson seconded the motion and same carried.

David Eklund, Roger Asche, Glen Thompson and David Jacobson, members of the Sargent County Fairboard met with the commissioners to discuss the Sargent County Fair. Secretary Jacobson presented the commissioners with the 1984 financial statement. The statement showed a loss of \$2,600.00. The fairboard members feel it is necessary to have more revenues and would like to put the question to a vote of the electors of Sargent County. The question must be voted on at the next special or general election. Said request will be considered by the commissioners in 1986. The Fairboard also reminded the commissioners of several areas which need work or repairs prior to the 1985 fair. They are: 1) Bury overhead wire in the carnival area to enable use of more space for rides, etc.; 2) Maintain parking lot on the east side of the fairgrounds and north of the main entrance; 3) Purchase a canopy to use in front of the grandstand; 4) Install Reserved Parking signs and Handicapped Parking signs and continue looking for a new location for the Sargent County Museum.

Commissioner Manikowski moved that the Board approve Games of Chance Permit No. 84-07 to St. Mary's Altar Society, Geneseo, ND for raffle and bingo on January 6 & 20, February 3 & 17, March 3, 17 & 31, 1985. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and same carried.

The Board read a letter from Midwest Mutual Insurance Company informing the Board that effective January 14, 1985, they will cancel Insurance Policy Nos. 9900-097 & 9-910-253 in accordance with terms and conditions of the policies.

The Board discussed the placement of a culvert on the county road near Rutland. Commissioner Manikowski will see what has been done up to now and report at the next meeting.

Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the Board adjourn to December 4, 1984 at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioner Johnson seconded the resolution and on roll call vote all commissioners voted aye and the resolution was duly declared carried and adopted.





The following bills were audited. Commissioner Mag Anderson moved that the bills be paid. Commissioner Manikowski seconded the motion and same carried unanimously.


