September 3, 1884

Board met, commissioners present Herring, Haskell, and Newman. The
minutes of the last session were read and approved. The following
bill was allowed. R. Jeanson, for chairs furnished the county, \$14.30

Resolved. That the following taxes for the current fiscal year be levied as
follows: A bridge tax of two mills on a dollar, a road tax of one mill on a dollar,
for a county sinking fund a tax of one and one half mills on a dollar. For ordinary
county revenue, including the support of the poor, six mills on the dollar.

Resolved, That Sargent county, be and the same is hereby divided into voting precincts
as follows: That Townships 131 and 132, Range 53 compose one voting precinct, to be
known as Wild Rice.

That townships 129 and 130, range 53, compose one precinct to be known as South
East precinct.

That townships 132, range 54 compose one precinct known as Milnor precinct.

That townships 130 and 131, range 54, compose one precinct to be known as Kandiotka.

That township 129 in ranges 55 and 56, compose one precinct to be known as Taylor.

That township 130, ranges 55 and 56, compose one precinct to be known as Forman.

That township 131, ranges 55 and 56 compose one precinct to be known as Dunbar.

That township 132, ranges 55 and 56, compose one precinct to be known as White Stone Hill.

That township, 132 range 57 and 58 compose one precinct to be known as Vivian.

That township 131 ranges 57 and 58 compose one precinct to be known as Pleasant View.

That township 130, ranges 57 and 58, compose one precinct to be known as Sargent.

That township 129, ranges 57 and 58, compose one precinct to be known as Southwest.

That that part of township 129, range 54 lying north of the Indian reservation, be annexed
and become a part of Kandiotka, and that part of township 129 range 54, lying west
of the Indian reservation be annexed and become a part of Taylor.
