

Report on bridge length by 16 feet in width, one span, mudsills 9 by 10, 5 stringers 6 by 12, 20 feet long. The floor of said bridge to be of 2 inch plank, 16 feet long. The posts from mudsills to stringers to be 8 by 10 and at least 4 feet high, 3 posts on a side and braced with 4 by 4, caps to mudsills to be 8 by 8, 18 feet long.
