Motion made by Holding that Henry Weber be made road overseer of road district No 13. seconded by Catten and carried.

Motion made by Holding that Resolution adopted at meeting held February 1st 1887, be corrected, so as to contain sections 19 and 20, Township 130, Range 54, in new school township organized at said meeting in February 1887; and said school township be numbered 17. seconded by Herman, Carried.

Motion made by Holding that school township number 17 be made a road district and numbered 18. seconded by Herman; Carried.

Motion made by Holding that A. H. Stewart be made road overseer of road district No 18. seconded by Herman; Carried.

Motion made by Holding that a vacancy be declared in the office of Constable John Morrison having left the Territory, seconded by Herman and carried.

Motion made by Holding that Isaac Mor be appointed to fill the vacancy caused by John Morrison leaving Territory, seconded and carried. Patten present.

Motion made by Holding that a vacancy be declared in the office of constable, M. J. Haller refusing to qualify. seconded and carried.

A petition presented asking that a bridge be built across slough on the quarter section line running from the middle of section 8, Township 132, Range 54, to the south line thereof; and that the County make an appropriation for said bridge.

Board called to order by J. H. Nicholson, Chairman, according to adjournment.

Petition presented asking that sections 28 and 33, Township 131, Range 56, of Millsburgh School Township, and sections 4, 9, 16 and 21, Township 130, Range 56 of Sargent School Township, be annexed to Center School Township.

Motion made by Holding that petition be granted. Seconded by Catten and carried.

Petition asking for Township 130, Range 56, to be organized as Civil Township, was again taken up.

Motion made that petition be granted and that an election be ordered. Seconded by Herman and carried.

Ordered; That an election be held on the 21st day of March 1887, for the purpose of electing two Justices of the Peace, two Constables, one Town Clerk, one assessor, one Town Treasurer, one Overseer of Highways, and three Supervisors; said election to be held at the Midland House in the village of Forman.

The following persons were appointed to act as Judges at such election, viz: A. E. Land, J. H. Curdy and W. A. Ellsworth.

Ordered, That the Auditor be instructed to make out notices of election, notices to Judges, furnish poll books, ballot box, and key and deliver the
