Motion made by Barton, that the petition be granted and that the part lying east of the dividing line be and retain the number and name of Denver, and that part lying west of said dividing line be and is hereby made school Township No. 19. Seconded by Patten and carried.

Motion made by Barton that the liquor license bond of Barney Berrous as principal, with Ole Ruswick and Nicholas Schmitt as sureties, be approved. Seconded and carried.

A petition presented asking that the NW<sup>1/4</sup> of Section 33, Township 130, Range 54 be annexed to School Township No 18 and detached from School Township No 14.

Motion made by Barton, that petition be referred back, for correction, there being no School Township No 18. Seconded by Patten and carried.

Curdy 1 vote; For Treasurer, Charles Moore received 37 votes; For Assessor, Abe Hendricks received 37 votes, F. H. Curdy 1 vote; For Justice of the Peace, Frank Zimmerman, received 36 votes, W. C. Forman 38 votes, F. H. Curdy 1 vote; For Constables, Will David received 35 votes, Harry Forman 37 votes, A. E. Land 1 vote; For Overseer of Highways, Carl Crandall received 38 votes; For Name of Civil Township, Forman received 35 votes, Cuckeye received 3 votes.

J. C. Crandall, J. C. Brandt and L. L. Newman, receiving the greatest number of votes, are declared elected Supervisors; A. H. Heath receiving the greatest number of votes, is declared elected Clerk; Charles Moore, receiving the greatest number of votes, is declared elected Treasurer; Abe Hendricks, receiving the greatest number of votes, is declared elected Assessor; Frank Zimmerman and W. C. Forman, receiving the greatest number of votes, are declared elected Justice of the Peace; Will David and Harry Forman, receiving the greatest number of votes, are declared elected Constables; Carl Crandall, receiving the greatest number of votes, is declared elected Overseer of Highways; Forman receiving the greatest number of votes, for the name of Civil Township, it is declared that be the name of said Township.
