The following proposition was offered by A. J. Price:

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County I. I. Gentlemen:

I respectfully ask you to consider the act of Legislature in regard to chapter 134 of the Session Laws of 1887, whereby it is required to keep grantor and grantee indices to conveyances and other instruments of record in his office affecting real estate, and submit the following proposition for your honorable consideration. I will transcribe to the Grantor and Grantee indices, taking the same from the records now in my office, and according to the act above stated, all transfers affecting real estate, for the sum of 3 cents a description for all descriptions; this to include all transfers made prior to January 1st 1888.
