Petition from voters and residents in twp. 129, range 58, asking to have said township organized into a civil township under the name of Southwest Civil Township, the boundaries of said township to be the congressional lines of tp. 129-58, was presented, said petition signed by 26 petitioners.

On motion the petition was granted and an election ordered held on the 25th day of March, 1890, at the Allen school house in township 129-58 for the purpose of electing the proper officers of said civil township, the judges of said election to be O. H. P. Moore, W. H. Kincaid and H. H. Balding. The auditor was instructed to cause to be posted notices of said election according to law. On motion board adjourned till 7 o'clock p. m.

The matter of bonding the County for the purpose of procuring seed wheat for needy farmers of the County has been for several days discussed and considered by the board and a motion to issue bonds for that purpose to the amount of eight thousand Dollars \$8,000 was made and recorded. On question being submitted, Chesney and Christensen voted for bonds, Holland, Young and King against.

Motion made that the County advertise for bids for the furnishing of Stationery, blank books and supplies

for the different officers of the county, from April 1st '90 to March 31st '91. Carried.

Motion made that such bids be advertised for in the Rutland Journal for three consecutive weeks. Carried.
