

Forman N. D. March 31st 1890

Board of County Commissioners met in special session in accordance with the call of the Chairman to act on the resignation of W. P. Price Register of Deeds and to fill the vacancy in said office caused by said resignation. Members present Messrs. Chesney, King, Christianson, Holland and Young Board was called to order by Chairman. Chesney Price's resignation was read by the Chairman Motion made and carried that the resignation be accepted Moved by Mr. Christianson that the Board proceed to ballot for register of deeds. Motion seconded and carried Motion made and carried that the Chairman appoint two tellers. The Chairman appointed as such tellers Messrs. King and Christianson. On the first ballot H. E. Sada received two votes, B. P. Chesney received two votes, one ballot blank. There being no choice the Chairman ordered another ballot. Mr. King moved that the Board consult the District Attorney as to the legality of the Board to choose one of its own members for the office of register of Deeds. Seconded by Mr. Holland. Motion carried. Motion made and carried that the Board adjourn till four o'clock P. M. Four o'clock P. M. Board met and was called to order by Chairman Chesney. All members present. District Attorney Bishop appeared before the Board and filed his opinion asked for by the Board. Second ballot taken resulting as follows. B. P. Chesney received three votes; H. E. Sada received two votes. The Chairman declared B. P. Chesney appointed Register of Deeds. B. P. Chesney filed his resignation as Commissioner for third district. B. P. Chesney being Chairman the Board proceeded to appoint a temporary Chairman The motion was put by Mr. Christianson and carried. Young in the Chair. Motion made by King that the Board adjourn, seconded by Holland. King and Holland voted yes Christianson voted no. The Chairman declared the motion carried. Attest. Chas. Alden
