

Forman A. D. April 7th 1890

Board met pursuant to adjournment and was called to order by Young. On motion Young was appointed chairman pro tem. Board organized itself into an appointing board. Members present. Young, Christianson, King, J. H. Vail, probate judge and Chas. Odem Auditor. Board proceeded to fill the vacancy in the board caused by the resignation of Mr. Chesney. Moved that the vote for commissioner be taken by ballot. Carried. On motion the chair was to appoint two tellers. Chair appointed Christianson and King as tellers. The result of the first ballot was as follows. S. C. Lilly two votes, J. B. Brandt two votes and E. A. Hendricks one vote for choice. The result of the second ballot was as follows. E. A. Hendricks three votes, S. C. Lilly one vote and J. B. Brandt one vote. E. A. Hendricks having received a majority of the votes cast was declared appointed County Commissioner for Sargent County. On motion the Board as an appointing board, adjourned sine die. Board of County Commissioners met according to adjournment and was called to order by Young chairman pro tem. Members present Young, Christianson, King, and Hendricks. E. A. Hendricks having duly qualified entered upon the duties of his office. On motion the board adjourned till seven o'clock P. M. Seven o'clock, P. M. Board in session. All members present except Holland. On motion Board proceeded to ballot for Chairman. On motion Hendricks and Christianson were appointed as tellers. First ballot: Christianson received two votes, Young one vote and one vote blank. Second ballot: Christianson received three votes and one blank. Christianson having received a majority of all votes cast was duly elected Chairman of the Board. The official bond of C. P. Chesney as Register of Deeds in the sum of \$8,000.00 with H. E. Patterson, John F. Devlin, Peter Christianson, A. H. Ayers, William Hurly and A. J. Price as sureties was presented and on motion approved. On motion board adjourned till April 10th 1890.
