On motion the action taken by the Board on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of March 1890 in regard to the issuing of bonds to procure seed wheat for needy farmers, was rescinded by the Board & Whereas it appears to the satisfaction of this board on a full investigation of the premises

That a necessity exists for furnishing seed grain to certain needy farmers resident of the County and having been petitioned in writing by over one hundred free holders resident of the County to issue the bonds of the County for said purpose and said petition having been duly considered by this board and it having been decided by a majority vote of the board that the prayer of said petition be granted and all things having been done as required by the provisions of an act authorizing Counties to issue bonds to procure seed grain for needy farmers resident therein passed by the legislative assembly of the state of North Dakota and amendment thereto: therefore Resolved that we issue and we do hereby issue and cause to be issued the bonds of this County as provided for in said act for the sum of \$3000.00, that said bonds shall be in denominations of five hundred dollars each and draw interest at the rate of seven per cent per annum payable semi-annually and said funds to be due and payable five years from the date thereof.

On motion the auditor was instructed to advertise for the sale of said bonds in the Sargent County, Teller Bismark Tribune and Pioneer Press of St Paul Minn according to law. Be it Resolved by the Board that the County issue \$3000. worth or as much as is needed thereof in warrants drawn on the seed wheat fund said warrants to draw 7 per cent per annum and be redeemed Oct. 20<sup>th</sup> 1890.

On motion the Auditor was instructed to draw warrants to the amount of \$3000. on the seed wheat fund. Be it Resolved that we allow the Auditor \$50. a month clerk hire from the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 1890 on the terms that the Auditor Elias Alden is not to be allowed any for extra work from said 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 1890. This additional clerk hire is required by the new revenue law which adds to the Auditor's duties a great amount of new work and provides for necessary clerk hire for said office. On motion Young was appointed as a committee of one to make arrangements for the delivery of seed wheat at Straubville and Havana
