Notice is hereby given that a special session of the Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County, North Dakota, will be held at Forman, N. D. on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1890, for the purpose of executing the seed grain bonds.

The Board of County Commissioners of Sargent County, North Dakota, met this day at Forman, pursuant to a special call.

Present, Christiansen, Young and Holland.

Mr. Young introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Resolved That pursuant to the action already taken, and the proceedings heretofore had by this Board relative to the issuance of bonds of the County of Sargent, pursuant to an act of the Legislative assembly of the State of North Dakota, entitled "an act authorizing counties to issue bonds to procure seed grain for needy farmers resident therein," approved February 14<sup>th</sup> 1890, bonds of said County of Sargent be issued in the aggregate sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.) to-wit:

Six (6) bonds of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.) each to bear date May 14<sup>th</sup> 1890, to become due May 14<sup>th</sup> 1895, to be numbered consecutively from 21 to 26 inclusive, to be made payable at the American Exchange National Bank, in the City of New York, New York, to bear interest at the rate of seven (7) per cent. per annum, payable semiannually, coupons representing the interest to be attached to each bond, bonds to be payable to F. R. Fulton, or bearer; and the Chairman of this Board and the County Auditor are hereby instructed to execute said bonds in the proper form and to affix the seal of the County thereto, and when so executed to deliver them to the County Treasurer who shall deliver them to F. R. Fulton & Co., at the Citizens National Bank in the City of Grand Forks, North Dakota on full payment thereof being made by said F. R.

Fulton & Co., in accordance with their bid accepted by this Board on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1890, the bid of said F. & C. Fulton & Co., being the highest bid made. Which resolution was duly adopted. On motion Board adjourned sine die.
