Site for Bridge

Resolution
to offer gopher
bounty.

The following resolution was introduced and on motion adopted:

Be it Resolved, That the county offer a bounty of two cents upon each gopher ^{tail} presented to the town clerk, whose duty it shall be, after having counted the same, to forthwith issue a certificate to the person or persons presenting such tails, and upon any person or persons presenting such certificate to the county auditor, the said officer shall draw a warrant on the county treasurer, for the amount stated in said certificate.

Provided that no bounty will be paid by the county, for any gopher.
