Notice of order to destroy Russian thistles and other weeds

The following notice was ordered published according to law.
Notice is hereby given that in compliance with section 1 chap. 91 session laws of 1891 every person and every corporation shall destroy upon all lands which any such person or corporation shall own or occupy all weeds of the kind known as Canada thistle, water-burs, mustard, wild oats, French weeds and Russian cactus between the 1st and 15th day of June, 1892.

In case any person or corporation owning or occupying any lands as above mentioned, neglects or refuses to comply with the provisions of the above named act, the road overseers or supervisors of the respective civil townships of the county shall, after the expiration of 10 days after the said 15th day of June, 1892, forthwith destroy such weeds in such manner as shall effectually prevent such weeds from growing into seed.
