Question of  
the building  
of a new  
court house  
and jail

Whereas, In the judgment of a majority of the board of county  
 commissioners of the county of Dargent, in the state of North Dakota  
 such county of Dargent has insufficient and inadequate building  
 for its use as a court house and a jail, and the lease by the  
 said county of the building now occupied as a court house will  
 expire on or about July 1<sup>st</sup> 1893.

We do hereby Order an election to be held in the said county  
 on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1892, for the purpose of determining  
 by vote of the electors of said county of Dargent the question of  
 issuing the bonds of said county for the purpose of the erection of a  
 courthouse at Forman, said county.

Further Resolved, That the amount of such bonds to be  
 issued and voted upon shall be ten thousand dollars.  
 The denominations of such bonds shall be one thousand dollars each.  
 The said bonds shall run and be due and payable as follows:  
 In twenty years from date of issue, with right and option to pay  
 the same at any time after 10 years after the date of the issue of the same.  
 The rate of interest which the said bonds shall bear shall not  
 exceed six per cent, per annum to be paid annually.
