On motion the county auditor was instructed to appear in behalf of the county, with the state's attorney, in the matter of the final settlement of accounts in the estate of Peter Carlson, at the June term of the County Court, being June 15, 1896.

On motion the sales made for paid grain tax against the following described lands were ordered cancelled, the law under which said sales were made, having been declared unconstitutional: N8¹/₄ and SW¹/₄ 34-130-57 and E¹/₂ of SW¹/₄ and lots 3 & 4 - 19-130-55.

The County Treasurer and County Auditor were on motion instructed to cancel the aforesaid sales off their respective records.

On motion Frank Maxson was awarded the work of painting the outside of the court house and vault, the said work to be as follows:

Two coats of paint, said paint to be St. Louis white lead and pure linseed oil; all broken and split siding to be replaced and loose boards and casings nailed fast; to repair the roof on vault in such a manner so the same will shed water; to paint the roof of the vault and stripe the sides thereof in imitation of brick.

The said mason to furnish and pay for all material to be used in said work and receive therefor the sum of \$95.00 when the board shall have accepted and approved the same.

On motion A. W. Carlblom was appointed a committee to superintend and see that the above work is performed as specified.

On motion \$40.00 was appropriated out of the general county fund to help defray expenses of the teachers institute.

The following resolution was introduced and on motion adopted:

Resolved, That the noxious weeds known as cockle burr, mustard and French weeds, be destroyed on or before July 10, 1896 in the following manner: said weeds to be mown and soil summer-fallowed, or said weeds to be pulled and burned as often as will prevent them from going to seed.

For the destruction of Russian cactus, said weed to be pulled and burned on or before September 10, 1896.
