Mr. Johnson, reported as follows, viz:
That according to his best judgment said bridge was a necessity, and that he would recommend that either a wooden or combination bridge be built; That he had interviewed the official Board of said Township of Milnor, and that they had agreed to furnish the necessary stone for the abutments to said bridge; and he recommended further that said bridge should be built with 22 feet span, 16 feet wide and 6 feet high.
