On motion the following places were designated for the sale of chattel mortgaged property for the ensuing year, viz: At the front door of the Post Office in each of the following places, viz: Straubville, Cogswell, Harlem, Havana, Rutland, Seneca, Ransom, Cayuga, De Lancey, Nichols, Forsby, Hamble, and Milnor; also at the front door of the Court House in the town of Forman.

The following Resolution was presented, viz:

Be it Resolved, That all weeds known as Canada Thistle, Cockle Burr, Mustard, Wild oats, French weed, and Russian Cactus shall be destroyed before the first day of June, and the first day of August; said weeds to be mowed, and the soil summer-fall plowed, or said weeds to be pulled and burned as often as will prevent them from bearing seed.

On motion the foregoing Resolution was adopted, and the Auditor instructed to give notice accordingly.

The quarterly report of J. E. Bishop as States Attorney, stating that no money or monies had been received by him, as such States Attorney during said quarter was presented,

On motion the Report was accepted and ordered placed on file.
