The Board of County Commissioners of Sargent Co, North Dakota met at the office of the county auditor, pursuant to adjournment,

1896 tax cancelled on the SE 1/4 35-132-57

Mr Seltvick moved that the 1896 tax on the SE 1/4 35-132-57 be cancelled, for the reason that said land was government, land up to the year 1902, which motion prevailed.

Lot 15, blk 33, Harlem sold to Harry Michel

On motion the Auditor was authorized and instructed to sell and transfer all the interest of the county, in lot 15, block 33, Harlem Village to Harry Michel, for a sum equal in amount to the original tax for the years 1892 to 1902 inclusive, with interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum; said lot having become forfeited to the county under the provisions of Sec. 1270 and 1271 of the Revised Codes; Mr Michel agreeing to pay the sheriff's fees, and waive all rights to refundment in case the deed given by the county should be set aside.

School poll ref'd to John Pours

On motion a school poll illegally assessed against John Pours was ordered refunded,

P. P. tax, J. R. Baker cancelled.

Present Messrs Lund, Johnson, Swens and Seltvitt,
 Mr Seltvitt moved that the 1902 personal property tax assessed against J. R. Baker in Jackson Twp. be cancelled, Mr Baker having shown that all his property had been assessed in Sargent Twp.
 Which motion prevailed.

1901 tax John Angel or D. W. Twp. cancelled

Mr Johnson moved that the application of John Bergels, jr for cancellation of the 1901 tax assessed against him in South West Twp. be accepted, said application showing that the same stock had been assessed and taxes paid in Jackson Twp. Which motion prevailed.

Appr. Magnus Anderson for refundment of road tax rejected.
