Resolution
Gopher bounty

Be it resolved; That the county of Sargent offer and allow a bounty on gophers for the season of 1903, as follows:

For each pocket gopher killed in said county between the dates of April 1st and July 10th 1903, a bounty of five cents.

For any other gopher killed in said county, a bounty of three cents; if the same be killed and tails are presented for payment between the dates of April 1st and June 1st 1903; and for gophers killed between June 1st and July 10th a bounty of two cents.

All of said bounties to be paid for the Gopher Destruction Fund upon the warrant of the County Auditor, - provided that the county auditor shall issue such warrants upon the certificate of one of the county commissioners, who shall hereafter be designated by the Board to attend at the County Auditor's office on the following days, viz:

May 2nd, May 16th, June 1st, June 13th
June 27th and July 10th, 1903

Mr Peterson moved that the foregoing resolutions be adopted.

Mr Marcelus moved that in the counting of tails for the gopher bounty any tails presented by persons who have bought or traded for the same shall not be counted, and that any attempt to defraud be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

A petition for the tax payers of Jewambon Township, stating that the personal property assessment of Mary Deschon for the year 1901 was too high and out of proportion to other assessments in the township for the same year, having been presented, on motion the valuation of Mary Deschon for 1901 was reduced to \$100.
