Mr Straub moved that Mr Deltor act as chairman of the County Board of Revenue and Equalization, which motion prevailed.

Co. Aud. Clerk

Mr Ditzler moved that the county auditor act as clerk of the Board, which motion prevailed.

Ass't of Dym Eagleston reduced

Byron Eagleson appeared before the Board in regard to his assessment in Jackson Twp.

Mr Ditzler moved that 10 head of two-year-old cattle be stricken from the assessment of Mr Eagleson, and that said stock be assessed to Fred Bischof, which motion prevailed.

Mr Straub moved that the assessment of agricultural tools, implements and machinery against Mr Eagleson be reduced to \$150.

Which motion prevailed.

Real property

Mr Peterson moved that the Board proceed to review and equalize the assessment of real property, which motion prevailed.

Weber red, 6%

Mr Straub moved that for the purpose of equalization the average value of lands in Weber Twp. be reduced 6 per cent, which motion prevailed.

Taylor raised 5%

Mr Peterson moved that for the purpose of equalization the average value of lands in Taylor Twp. be raised 5 per cent, which motion prevailed.

Born raised 4%

Mr Straub moved that for the purpose of equalization the average value of lands in Born Twp be raised 4 per cent, which motion prevailed.
