Be it Resolved, that the County of Sargent offer and allow a bounty on gophers for the season of 1904, as follows;

For each pocket gopher killed in said county between the dates of April 1st and November first, 1904, a bounty of five cents. For each other gopher killed in said county during the same period, a bounty of two cents.

Said bounties to be paid from the gopher destruction fund upon the warrant of the county auditor; -

Provided, that the county auditor shall issue such warrants upon the certificate of one of the county commissioners, who shall hereafter be designated by the board to attend at the office of the county auditor on the following days: May 16th, June 6th, June 27th, and July 11th.

B. Holmes, inspectors, and George A. Stule, clerk of said meeting, that said meeting or election was held at the time appointed, and was in all respects conducted according to law; that the whole number of persons voting at such meeting was thirty-five; that the number voting for incorporation was thirty-two, and the number voting against incorporation was three, which said report was verified by the affidavits of said inspectors and clerk, and the Board being satisfied as to the legality of said election, it is hereby ordered that said village has been incorporated with the name of Village of Havanna,
