Taxes abated on lots 1 to 12, blk 22, Milnor

Mr Ditzler moved that the auditor and treasurer be authorized to accept the sum of \$45.00 in full settlement of all taxes held by the county against lots from one to twelve in block 22, Town of Milnor, except the taxes of the year 1903, which motion prevailed.

Lot 22, blk 1 Forman ordered sold

Mr Marcellus moved that the auditor be authorized and instructed to sell and transfer all the interest of the county in lot 22, block 1, Town of Forman to George B. Blomer for a sum equal in amount to the original tax levied against said property for the years 1889, 1890, 1891, 1892, 1893 and 1897, ^{and sheriff's fees} and ^{paid} properly become forfeited to the county for taxes of the years 1889, 1890, 1891, 1892, 1893 and 1897, which motion prevailed.

Tax refunded E.H. Forman

Mr Straub moved that the 1903 tax paid by E.H. Forman on lots 22, 23 and 24, Second Addition to Forman, amounting to 88 cents, be refunded, said tax having been levied upon an ~~exorbitant~~ valuation, which motion prevailed.

Tax refunded to J.G. Jones

Mr Peterson moved that the 1902 and 1903 taxes on lots 13 and 14, block 3, Cupers Addition to Neiland be refunded, said taxes having been paid by mistake, which motion prevailed.

Tax cancelled SW 1/4 32-132-57

Mr Peterson moved that the 1898 tax on the SW 1/4-32-132-57 be cancelled, and a refunding order for the amount of tax be drawn in favor of the holder of the tax-sale certificate; said land being government land, and not subject to taxation, which motion prevailed.

Tax abated lot 8, blk 2, Cupers Add.

Mr Ditzler moved that the auditor be authorized to make settlement of the 1896 tax on lot 8, block 2, Cupers Addition to Neiland, on the basis of the original tax at 7 per cent, which motion prevailed.

Bridge in Milnor Twp

Mr Marcellus moved that the auditor be directed to notify the Board of Supervisors of Milnor Twp to grade the approaches to the county bridge built by Mads Olson in 1901, or failing to do so within 60 days said bridge will be removed, which motion prevailed.
